#### From the Pastor's Desk.....

Today is the Second Sunday in ordinary time and we hear from the Book of Samuel who lived during a major transitional period in Israel's history. After Israel arrived in the promised land around 1200 BC and conquered the Caananites under the leadership of Joshua, the land was eventually divided into twelve regions, one for each of the twelve tribes of Israel. After the death of Joshua, "judges" were assigned as military leaders of the tribes. This system of governance, called "the period of the judges," lasted about 200 years until the establishment of the monarchy around 1020 BC. The final two judges were Eli and Samuel. Samuel had the distinct role of being the last judge as well as the prophet at the beginning of the monarchy. The opening verses we hear today describe how Hannah gave her son Samuel to the Lord in thanksgiving for receiving him when she thought she was barren. Eli raised him in the temple and it is to Eli that Samuel turns when he begins to hear God's voice.

Paul's first letter to the Corinthians will be read for the next five weeks. Some of his converts felt that they had complete freedom in Christ which gave way to immorality and Paul today lays out his moral code.

Our gospel reading from John recounts the call of the first disciples. Each gospel author gives us a distinct version of how this event took place. John alone tells us that John the Baptist points Jesus out to two of his disciples and John alone calls Jesus "the lamb of God." In John, Jesus' first spoken words are "What are you looking for?" both a challenge and an invitation. John alone tells us that Andrew was a disciple of John the Baptist and that when Jesus meets Simon, he immediately renames him Cephas (Peter). The renaming, for John, signifies the leadership

role Peter will assume.

Pope Francis recently celebrated Saturday evening Mass at the Roman parish of San Giuseppe all"Aurelio and talked about babies crying in church. He said, "Children's tears are the best sermon. Children cry, they are noisy, they don't stop moving. But it really irritates me when I see a child crying in church and someone says they must go out. God's voice is in a child's tears; they must never be kicked out of church." Don't you love this guy!!!!!

We would like to form a group of "greeters" for the funerals at St. Patrick's. If we could get two people for each funeral to be in the back of church, distribute the programs and missalettes and then collect them at the end of Mass. If you would be interested in doing this, please call the parish office. I am also always in need of additional adult servers for funerals. If interested, we would train you and schedule you at your convenience.

In addition, we need more Eucharistic Ministers at St. Patrick's. If you would be interested in becoming one, please call the office. We will train you and schedule you according to your schedule.

We are in need of a new freezer for the Food Pantry and are in the process of researching what would be the best kind to get. Unfortunately, the cost of this will be in the neighborhood of \$10,000 but it's something we have to have. We'll get it paid for somehow.

We're continuing to line up volunteers for the upcoming Homeless Shelter in February. St. Jude parishioners are going to take the last 3 days which means we will be covering 11 days rather than the full 14. I've been overwhelmed at the response ranging from people volunteering, offering to fix dinner or breakfast for 60 people, etc. One parishioner gave me \$2,000, half of which we

give to the Russian Church of the Nativity to cover the costs of utilities, coffee, etc. that will accompany our using their Social Center for the Shelter.

In conjunction with the diocese, the parish office will be closed Monday, Jan. 19 for Martin Luther King day.

In addition, a number of people have volunteered at St. Martin's Center. They have a wide range of volunteer positions open and if you contact them, they will explain them to you and see if you would be interested in helping. One of our parishioners gave me 40 \$50 gift cards to Wegman's which were then distributed to needy families through St. Martin's Center.

Diocesan priests had a Study Week this past week at St. Mark's Center, the final day of which was an updated presentation on pastoral planning for the diocese. One of the days was on the Church and Parish Life: Today and Tomorrow and another was on Pastoral leadership during changing times. That workshop included models on dealing with resistance and conflict when they arise.

The Pew Research Center reports how dramatically family life is changing in America. Their new studies shows that in 1960, 73% of American children under the age of eighteen were living with their married parents. That percentage has now fallen to 46%. Today, 41% of children under 18 were born outside of marriage (that figure was only 5% in 1960). About 15% are living with one parent who has divorced and remarried, 4% are living with parents who are cohabiting but not married and 5% are living with a grandparent.

Mrs. Terri asked her Sunday school class to draw pictures of their favorite Bible stories. She was puzzled by Kyle's picture, which showed four people on an airplane, so she asked him which story it was mean to represent. "The flight to Egypt," was his reply. Pointing at each figure, she said, "That must be Mary, Joseph and Baby Jesus. But who is the fourth person?" "Oh, that's Pontius, the pilot."





**HOMELESS SHELTER**—As mentioned previously, St Patrick's Parish is hosting a homeless overflow shelter February 11-24 at the Russian Church of the Nativity Social Center at Front & German Streets. We are in need of WINTER clothing (new or clean used) for men and women, i.e., underwear, socks, sweatshirts, jeans, hats, gloves, shoes, boots, coats, etc. We also need personal hygiene items, i.e., toothpaste, toothbrushes, deodorant, razors, shaving cream, bath products, combs, brushes, feminine hygiene products and hand sanitizer. The shelter also is in need of disinfectant sprays and wipes, trash bags (large black & tall kitchen w/drawstrings), paper products (plates, bowls, cups, cutlery, napkins, paper towels & toilet paper) and black permanent markers.
