

Today is the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time and we again hear first from the prophet Isaiah. Knowing to whom we matter gives us a sense of who we are. One can forego many things on a perilous journey but woe to the would-be explorer who lacks a

clear sense of identity. Scholars debate the identity of the "Suffering Servant" (was he Israel, the prophet himself or a future Messiah, but the Servant himself is clear about who he is: he is God's spokesperson, chosen from the womb to serve the Lord). Until now the servant has endured suffering and shame, but he has not given up. While the world may define us if we let it, the servant knows better: "I am made glorious in the sight of the Lord," he announces. In other words, it"s not my success that gives me strength but my God. But now he announces that God's mercy and salvation is going to be offered to the entire world, not just Israel. This comes as a great shock to Israel, hence the servant will be subjected to more suffering.

Paul, in his letter to the Corinthians, is again telling them that he is an apostle and that they are being called by Jesus to be his. Corinth was a city noted for its licentiousness, but Paul, in this lengthy greeting, indicates that Christians are not part of this. They have submitted themselves to Christ, not to the flesh. Paul alludes to issues he will address in his letter. Exhortations to holiness and right conduct we will hear during five of the next six Sundays.

Each year, the second Sunday of Ordinary Time offers a gospel from John instead of the designated evangelist for that year. In presenting these, they are focused on the manifestation of Jesus by using accounts of John the Baptist, the Wedding Feast at Cana, etc. John is particularly cautious in his gospel not to fuel any erroneous thinking about John the Baptist's superiority over Jesus. And, while John does not mention the baptism in his gospel, he does comment on the theological truth it reveals, which is Christ's unique status as God's Son. In this gospel account today, the Baptist, upon seeing Jesus, makes a profound declaration about Jesus's identity while also confessing his prior ignorance about the one whose way he was preparing. By declaring Jesus as the Lamb of God, John is already introducing the cross. Even this close to

Christmas, we are reminded that Calvary awaits this newborn.

According to an article in the Vatican newspaper, approximately 1,400 Catholic churches in the Netherlands will be deconsecrated in the next five years. Between 400 and 500 Protestant churches are also expected to close by 2018. Religious practice in the Netherlands has declined dramatically in the last 30 years. The Dutch bishops met with Pope Francis a few weeks ago and told him that in the 1950s, 95% of Dutch Catholics went to Mass. Today only 5% go. The archbishop of Utrecht said that of the 170 monasteries in the country, more than 150 will close in the next 10 years. They also told him that, unlike most European countries where churches are financed by the government, they get no subsidy and therefore the church is practically bankrupt. The Dutch bishops also told Pope Francis that Islam is fast becoming the largest religion in their country. Only 4% of Dutch are Protestant. What an incredible change in such a short period of time.

We are hoping to supply some volunteers to help with our neighbors at the Russian Church of the Nativity with their Feb. 12-26 opening of their Social Center at night to provide a meal and an over night for the homeless. Seven of our parishioners participated in this during December and I'm hoping that more will consider doing it in February. There will be an informational session on Wed..
