





Today is the 4th Sunday of Ordinary Time and our first reading comes from Deuteronomy. The Jewish people never said God's name aloud. To say his name was to call him into their presence and they felt that they could never be in his presence. Here Moses announces God's decision to send a prophet like himself whom they need not fear, for the people believed a direct encounter with God would result in death, since no mortal could survive God's presence. But God warns that intermediaries can bring problems, for some may ignore the words the prophet speaks in God's name. And God reminds them sternly that if they do so, "I myself will make him answer." Originally the passage referred to the whole line of prophets, but would later be refined to refer to Jesus.....Again our second reading comes from Corinthians and Paul is trying to answer their questions about marriage and sexuality. The problem is, taken out of context, the passage makes little sense and may even alienate some listeners. Paul's main intent may be best found in the first and last sentence where he is trying to be pastoral. Paul, like most early Christians believed that time was running out, that Christ would soon come again and so he urges people to maintain the status quo.....In our gospel, we finally turn to Mark and encounter an unclean spirit in the synagogue where Jesus is teaching. The people sense his authority, and the "spirit" knows who he is encountering and calls Jesus out. His tactic serves only to demonstrate further Jesus' character. The exorcism serves Mark's purpose of demonstrating Jesus' authority, though it's not his power to perform miracles that Mark wants to accent; rather the depth and power of his teaching. Driving out the spirit simply validates the supremacy of that teaching. The miracles says here is one whose authority is manifest in both word and deed.....I've just finished preparing a brochure that will be sent to all parishioners within the next few weeks concerning our upcoming restoration of St. Patrick's Church. I hope you will sit down as a family and review our goal, what funds we need to generate and decide together what you can do as a family to support this project. I think when you see the way it is broken apart and how manageable it will be for all us, you'll agree that this is very possible. We're going to conduct this appeal during Lent and hopefully have our pledges by Easter. To date, we have slightly more than \$250,000 raised toward our \$850,000 goal meaning we have yet to raise \$600,000—a sum significantly lower than what was raised here in the late 90s to undertake the restoration of the Stations, repairing the stained glass windows and pointing the exterior of the building. I know we can do this. I know we can.....Bishop Trautman has told me that we cannot begin this work until I have raised 50% of the necessary funds. I feel fully confident that we can do that and still be ready to start the work in mid-August.....Rick Statz from the Conrad Schmitt Studios is coming to Erie this week to spend a day with Chip Wachter, a parishioner and an architect who has been very involved with the Restoration Committee. At this time we'll decide where the "mock-up" will go and zero in on some dates.....I need to say something about weddings, and if I sound uncommonly stern—I am. Marriage is a sacrament in which two people give themselves to each other and seek God's help in pursuing that noble goal. However, some of the hysteria that surrounds weddings is beyond your comprehension. Brides have to learn to put this into proper perspective. It is a joyful time, a time to create a special day but it needs to be calmed down in many cases. What is now happening is that brides for 2013 are reserving a place for their reception and then calling here wanting that date for their wedding only to discover that it is not available. The hysterics which follow are beyond anything I've ever seen. Let me state clearly again our policy. NO wedding date is reserved at St. Patrick's Church until the reservation form is completed and accepted by the parish office. No exceptions and no further discussion. With the large number of weddings requested here, we have to do it this way.....Villa Maria Elementary School is hosting an Open House Sunday, January 29, from 1-3 PM. You can explore options available at their website www.velementary.com..... The American bishops have just received a report on the decline of Catholic chaplains for our military. There are presently 275,000 troops being served by only 198 active Catholic chaplains. That number of chaplains is down from 400 in 2001.....All of the priests from the Erie East Deanery are meeting this week to begin discussions on how we better coordinate things such as the unnecessary duplication of holyday Masses at which most of the churches are only 25% full. We're also trying to begin to coordinate with priests in other deaneries what we will say to the new bishop regarding the downsizing of Catholic schools and parishes. It is inevitable that it has to happen, and it's going to be very painful for a lot of people. How do we make it less painful? How do we make the decisions? One criterion will be spiritual viability, ie., are there more baptisms than deaths. A second would be financial considerations and finally proximity to another Catholic church.....A mother was preparing pancakes for her sons, Kevin who was 5 and Ryan, age 3. The boys began to argue over who would get the first pancake. Their mother saw the opportunity for a moral lesson and said, "If Jesus were sitting here, he would say 'Let my brother have the first pancake, I can wait.'" At that, Kevin turned to his younger brother and said, "Ryan, you be Jesus."


