



Today is the fifth Sunday in ordinary time and we hear our first reading from the Old Testament Book of Job. The whole of this book can be summed up in a few words: God is God and we are not. Great misfortune befalls Job and he wonders why. Common belief was that misfortune is God's punishment for wrong-doing, but that can't apply because Job is a righteous and good man. But when our pain becomes so great that all we can do is talk about it, we discover that a healthy option in the face of great trials is to acknowledge how awful the situation is and hope that God will be with us in the darkness.....Our second reading is from Paul's 1st Letter to the Corinthians. False teachers were begin-

ning to appear in Corinth who were willingly taking recompense for their preaching, and Paul does not want to be identified with them. He tells them that he is trying to be all things to all people. He will become weak to win over the weak, etc. He notes that while he preaches the Gospel willingly, even if he didn't want to he would have no choice because he has been entrusted by Christ to do so....Our excerpt from Mark's Gospel is distinctive in its simplicity. Contrast this reading of healing with our first reading from Job of suffering and no chance of escape. Mark notes that the whole town came, that they brought all of their sick, but that only "some" are healed. We're reminded again that God is God and we can only wonder why some are healed and others are not. We will find a persistent theme in Mark that his Jesus often goes off alone to pray before he does any teaching or healing.....A play, Late Nite Catechism, is coming to Erie March 22-25 at the Bayfront Convention Center. Tickets are \$37.50 and are available at the Tullio Arena Box Office, online at www.ErieBroadwaySeries.com or by phone at 452-4857. Late Nite Catechism is an uproarious piece of theater that takes audiences back—sometimes nostalgically, sometimes fearfully—to the children they once were. The irrepressible Sister teaches an adult catechism to a roomful of students (the audience). Over the course of the play, Sister goes from benevolent instructor rewarding students for correct answers with glow-in-the-dark rosaries and laminated saints cards to authoritative drill sergeant. The play gets rave reviews......Schutte Woodworks and Russells Uphostery are going to refinish the pews at St. Patrick's as part of our restoration. I'm grateful to Mary Pat Schlaudecker for taking the lead in this area of the project. Their plans call for removing 1/4 of the pews at a time and taking them to the plant to be done. They have to take each pew apart, assemble new cushions and fabric, reassemble the pews and finish them. They are also going to furnish us with a bid to build 8 new pews to replace those which were removed from the back of the church years ago. Another bid they are furnishing is to redo the doors from the vestibule into the main body of the church. They have taken a pew which was in the vestibule area and are going to restore it, furnish it with the new cushion and then let it be on display so that you can see the difference that will take place. I think you're going to be very pleased by what you see. The new fabric is both flame retardant and stain resistant. Suddenly these pews—which seem in the view of many to be out of place in this beautiful church—seem to blend in......We are hoping to be able to begin all of the restoration project- by mid-August, but that is completely dependent upon the bishop's demand that no work can begin until we have raised half of the money needed for the project. I'm counting on you and not worried!!......In discussion with Schutte Woodworks, we have jointly made the decision to delay the work on the pews until the restoration work is done in church. During the last painting of the dome, a can of paint accidently fell from the scaffolding and everything was covered. That threat plus the logistics of removing the pews while there is scaffolding in the building seems to lead us to the logical conclusion to wait. The restoration work, if we raise 50% of the money in cash, can begin in late August and be done by Christmas. Schutte can then take 1/4 of the pews at a time, refinish them, return them and take another guarter of the pews. We will rent chairs for the time and just keep moving them in church. They assure me that if they start after Christmas, they can be finished by Easter.....I mentioned earlier that a small group of women in the parish are starting to visit our shut-ins and take them Communion. I will continue to visit them on First Friday, but these women are just hoping that they can brighten the day of some people who are confined to their homes or a nursing home. If you have a family member or know of a parishioner who is house-bound and would like a visit, please call the parish office......I am giving a lecture on the History of St. Patrick's Parish at the Jefferson Society on February 23rd. That event is open to the public but reservations are needed......The new link on our web page that makes the Sunday Gospel and homily available is now working. I'm grateful to parishioner Debbie Brunner for implementing all of this. If anyone needs help with a web page, Debbie is the go to girl.....While working for an organization that delivers lunches to elderly shut-ins, a mother used to take her four year old daughter on her rounds. The little girl was unfailingly intrigued by the various appliances of old age, particularly the canes, walkers and wheelchairs. One day the mother found her staring at a pair of false teeth soaking in a glass. As she braced herself for the inevitable barrage of questions, the little girl merely turned to her mother and said, "The tooth fairy will never believe this."

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23

Gospel: Mark 1:29-39
