



Our Mass begins a bit differently today with the blessing of Palms and a gospel followed by the entrance procession. The opening gospel is full of prophecy from the OT. Jesus had to enter on a colt as Zechariah had foretold. The spreading of palms in his

path had been foretold in the Book of Kings. Luke alone inserts the line "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest" to highlight the multitude of heavenly hosts present at Christ's birth and now present again accompanying him to his death.

Our first reading from Isaiah concentrates on OT prophecies about the Messiah as the Suffering Servant.

Our second reading from Paul's letter to the Philippians, again focuses on suffering. Paul is writing from prison but is not discouraged for he has taken Christ as his model.

The Passion narrative today comes from Luke and contains elements unique to his telling the story, elements not found in other gospels. (We always read the Passion from John on Good Friday). Unlike Mark who dwells on the disciples failures and weaknesses, Luke portrays them in a much kinder light. He fails to mention that they fled when Jesus was arrested and Luke alone says there were men present at the cross. Luke's account of the Garden is far less dramatic than is found in Mark and Matthew. In Matthew and Mark Jesus withdraws from the disciples to pray. Not in Luke, and Luke says they fall asleep "for sorrow" and that they are found sleeping only once, not three times as in the other accounts.

Luke focuses on a Jesus who is not filled with sorrow or who lies prostrate on the ground. He has prayed often in this gospel and he does so now and concludes by accepting his father's will. Only in Luke do we have an angel come to comfort Jesus and Jesus rises ready to face his trial. Only in Luke does Jesus call Judas by name and forgoes the kiss of the other gospels. Only in Luke does Jesus heal the slave whose ear was cut off. In Luke alone, when Peter denies him 3 times, Jesus is watching and gives Peter a look not found in the other accounts.

Only in Luke do we have all of the high priests questioning him. Luke gives us a serene Jesus, unlike the majestic Jesus of John or the broken Jesus of Mark and Matthew. He portrays a Godgiven tranquility of one to whom the Father has delivered all things. Luke's staging of the trial is almost parallel to the trials he will later tell us in Acts of the Apostles that Paul endured. Luke alone has Jesus appear before Herod; he does not in the other accounts. And Herod, like Pilate, believes Jesus is innocent. Luke has no mocking by the soldiers. Luke alone has Jesus utter. "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do." And, finally, only in Luke do we have the onlookers begin to recognize what has happened and beat their breasts as he dies.

Today we begin the solemn observance of Holy Week. The festive Palm Sunday celebration will soon turn dark with the suffering and death of Jesus; but as promised he will rise from the dead and restore us to new life. The culmination of this week means that death is nothing more than a door to an eternal day.

We will celebrate Holy Thursday with a Mass at 7 PM at St. Patrick's Church. Following Mass, the Blessed Sacrament will be reserved in the weekday chapel until 10 PM.

On Good Friday, all Catholics are asked to observe the laws of fast and abstinence.

Stations of the Cross will be recited at St. Patrick's on Good Friday at noon. The Celebration of the Lord's Passion and the distribution of Holy Communion will take place at 2 PM. Church will remain open until 5 PM. Stations of the Cross will also be recited at St. Hedwig's at 11 AM.

On Holy Saturday, we will celebrate the Easter Vigil at St. Patrick's at 8 PM. On Easter Sunday there will be an 8 AM Mass at St. Patrick's, a 9 AM Mass at St. Hedwig's and a 10:30 AM Mass at St. Patrick's.

The parish office will close at noon on Holy Thursday and will not reopen until Tuesday, April 2nd.

Next Sunday, we will not only joyously celebrate the Resurrection, but we will hear our new carillon of bells for the first time. The Verdin Company of Cincinnati has been here installing the new Carillon system and the bells will peal joyously

Next Sunday's bulletin will include an insert listing the names of people whom you wish remembered as part of our Easter Sunday floral arrangements in church.

Erie Insurance has determined that there are major structural problems with the Cauley Auditorium. They were aware of this when they purchased the building from us over a year ago. The main problem is with the entire south wall which is buckling out and cannot be repaired without an incredible expenditure of money. Demolition of the building is scheduled to begin in late April or early May. Erie Insurance was kind enough to delay this move so that we could have use of the building for our weekend Masses while the church was being restored. Not only would they not accept any rent from us, but they also paid for the utilities and paid to have the A/C repaired. Erie Insurance has been incredibly good to St. Patrick's Parish.

At their recent meeting, the Irish Festival Committee voted unanimously not to have any vendors at the festival this year with the exception of our local Tipperary West and the popular jewelry booth staffed by Gail Smith and her volunteers. We do not make any profit from the vendors and with the growth in the size of the crowds, we can use the area they had for seating. We're also going to have two bars rather than one and adding an Irish Whiskey Tasting Booth. The festival will officially open on Friday evening, Sept. 13, with an Irish Bagpipe Band leading everyone into Rainbow Gardens. The festival will end on Saturday nite and Sunday morning will be an Irish Breakfast served at the site. We need to add additional registration tables for Saturday nite to avoid last year's long lines.

A new pastor was calling on parishioners and at one home it was obvious someone was home but not answering the door, so he wrote on his business card, "Revelation 3:20" and stuck it in the door. Sunday's collection contained his card and a message, "Genesis 3:10". Revelation 3:20 begins "Behold I stand at the door and knock." And Genesis 3:10 reads, "I heard your voice in the garden, but I was afraid because I was naked!!!"




