



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK....Today is the Fifth Sunday of Lent and we hear our first reading from the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah. The drama suggested in today's powerful reading is often repeated in our own lives: someone wrongs us, but then grace enables us to let go of our hurt and move ahead, and we invite the wrongdoer to move ahead with us. Like a lover wooing back an unfaithful beloved, God announces miraculous good news: "I will make a new covenant." And then God winces at the memory of Israel's infidelity: "It will not be like the covenant" made at Zion that "they broke." "But this is the covenant" that seals shut the door to the past. The clouds of memory part and the sun's new light shines in. Like a lover who carves names into a tree, God promises to "place my law within them" God says with profound simplicity, "I will be their God."....Our second reading comes from the New Testament Letter to the Hebrews. The author of this letter is unknown, and it is the only letter in the New Testament that does not begin with a greeting mentioning the author's name. For centuries Paul was identified as its author but contemporary scripture scholars dismiss that because of the differences of vocabulary and style from Paul's writings and the very different manner of introducing Old Testament citations. There is strong evidence that the author was a Jewish person of Greek background. It is believed to be a homily that was delivered and its date of authorship is much later than the Pauline epistles. Most scholars would date it in the 70's......The author is telling us not to be afraid to do what God's own son did: offer "prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears." Jesus' prayer was heard because of his reverent submission to God's will through which he learned "obedience."....Our gospel this week comes again from John. The text today is unique because it is Greek Gentiles, not Jews, asking the only two disciples with Greek names, Philip and Andrew, for an audience with Jesus. The apostles pass the decision to Jesus, but he makes no direct response, keeping his focus on the hour which has come. The remainder of the passage is suffused with the paradoxes that distinguish Christian faith: death leads to life; clinging to life is a sure way to lose it; defeat in the world's eyes means glorification in God's eyes. As Jesus announces that his hour has come, he speaks with full understanding of what lies ahead, like someone on a death bed consoling the relatives who have gathered, instead of being consoled by them. The reality of death appears to be overwhelming even to Jesus. "My soul is troubled..." is considered John's attempt at the Agony in the Garden. Knowing that he came for the very crisis he fears, Jesus resolves to accept it by asking God to turn the moment of his death into a moment of glory. The thundering voice from the sky gives testimony to Jesus for the sake of the crowds. Jesus' final words suggest resignation, inner peace and excitement over what his being lifted up will mean for everyone.....With Holy Week and Easter fast approaching, people are asking about the schedule. The Holy Thursday Mass will be held at 7 PM at St. Hedwig's. On Good Friday, Stations of the Cross will be at noon at St. Patrick's and the Celebration of the Lord's Passion at 2 PM also at St. Patrick's. The Easter Vigil will be held at St. Patrick's at 8:30 PM and on Easter Sunday we will have the regular 9 AM Mass at St. Hedwig's and the 10:30 AM Mass at St. Patrick's. The Parish Office will be closed Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Monday.....I mentioned last week that we are initiating online giving at St. Patrick's. All parishioners will receive a mailing outlining how it can be done. Anyone interested in using it can go to our webpage and key in the necessary information to allow an automatic deduction from your account for weekly giving or to participate in the capital campaign for the restoration of the church. Not only is this a convenience for parishioners, but it also helps in the parish office as it cuts down dramatically on the time needed to enter all of the envelope contributions each week. Once a parishioner sets this up, they will receive an automatic email each week telling them that the deduction has been made. The process can also be done with a credit card......If you will notice, there is a small pew in front of the Blessed Mother altar. This is a sample of what we are proposing to do with all of the pews in church. The material on the cushion is what will be used on both the cushion and the kneeler. I encourage you to take a minute to look at it and be sure to express your thoughts to any member of the Restoration Committee......You can also now see the "mock-up" on the side wall. This is what we are proposing to do for the entire interior of the church. There are two reasons for doing this. First is that you are able to see what the church will look like. This week you'll receive a mailing from the parish outlining the capital campaign we will undertake to raise the necessary funds to do this project. And, secondly, this is done so that it gives the Restoration Committee an opportunity to tweek it if there is something about it that they don't like. Perhaps they want to tone it down, or perhaps they want to add more decoration. Please feel free to share your thoughts on this proposal with myself or any member of the Restoration Committee......The new air conditioning will start to go in next week.....If our fund drive is a success and we are able to raise one half of our goal in cash by early September, we hope to close the church for about 2 1/2 months and complete the work. The weekday chapel will also be closed during this time and there will be no services in there. Funerals will be held at St. Hedwig's, weekend Masses in the Cauley Auditorium and weekday Masses in the chapel in St. Patrick's Rectory. There will be no activities of any kind in the church itself during this time. The Food Pantry will continue to operate as normal, but they are not in the church or the weekday chapel.....A little girl just finished her first week of school. "I'm just wasting my time," she said to her mother. 
