



Today is Palm Sunday, the beginning of the solemn observance of Holy Week. We begin our liturgy in a very different fashion with the celebrant near the entrance of church proclaiming Mark's Gospel story of Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem. Though Mark makes no mention of the prophecy in Zechariah announcing a king who would arrive riding a donkey, the detail that fills this passage clearly is a re-enactment of that foretelling. Mark portrays the crowd cheering and welcoming Jesus; the very same crowd who Jesus will soon pray to his Father to save him from that crowd...... After our entrance procession, we begin our Mass with a reading from Isaiah which tells us that God has taught his servant how to speak to the weary with a word that will rouse them. The word "rouse" which we rarely use today means encourage. God's servant speaks of how he freely endured the abuse of others. The image portrayed by the suffering Servant clearly anticipates what Jesus himself will endure.....Our second reading is one of the most elegant readings of the New Testament in which Paul proclaims to the Philippians that though Christ was God, he did not cling to his equality with God but instead became one of us. Scholars believe that Paul here is quoting a very early Christian hymn which calls us to imitate Christ who humbled himself and became obedient even unto death. As we continue this powerful reading, we hear proclaimed that "because of this," we should drop to our knees in adoration of this God who became man so that we can know eternal life......Our gospel today is the Passion account from Mark. It seems that the church will do all it can to confuse us this week by reading this account today and then on Good Friday we will read John's Passion—a dramatically different version. John, for example, presents a different agony in the garden, he never mentions Christ instituting the Eucharist at the last supper, etc. John will portray a regal Jesus who reigns from the cross and whose last words are the noble "Father, into your hands I comment my spirit." In Mark, we are going to get the most human portrait of Jesus anywhere in the gospels. Listen carefully to Mark's account of the agony in the garden—it is the most agonizing portrayal in the gospels. Jesus is broken, frightened, his disciples have abandoned him and his final words on the cross are the haunting, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"......Mass on Holy Thursday will be at St. Hedwig's at 7 PM. On Good Friday, the Stations of the Cross will be recited at noon at St. Patrick's and the Liturgy will be held at 2 PM. On Holy Saturday, the only Mass is at 8:30 PM at St. Patrick's and on Easter Sunday, the regular schedule will be followed with a 9 AM Mass at St. Hedwig's and a 10:30 AM at St. Patrick's......The parish office will be closed Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Monday......I encourage you to find some extra time this week to reflect on the meaning of these days and how these events completely alter our lives. Death no longer has any hold over us. That's an incredible realization, but let me assure you after spending 42 years of my life ministering to people at the time of death, it is the only thing that gets us through that moment......St. Hedwig Parish is grateful to Jay & Carol Habas for a very generous donation in memory of their aunt, Clara A. Kulig. As they wrote in the letter accompanying their gift, "St. Hedwig's held a special place in Clara's heart, and we want to honor her with this gift.".....The representatives from the Conrad Schmitt Studios of Milwaukee were here to meet recently with the Restoration Committee and to finalize our plans for the interior painting of the church. Work on the new electrical system and the new air conditioning system is presently underway and should be completed soon.....You will very soon be receiving a mailing from the parish outlining the capital campaign to raise the necessary money to complete the project. I'm hoping that you will sit together as a family and determine what you think you can contribute. Remember that we will not conduct the Catholic Services Appeal this year or for the next two years as we will fold that into the capital campaign. The diocese has a requirement that we must have 50% of the funds in cash before we can begin the project. I'm hoping that we can be at that point by the first of September and begin then. If that is the case, we will borrow the balance of the money from the diocese at a very low interest rate and pay it back as pledge payments come in. If we can stick to this timetable, we should be finished in time for Christmas.....Some parishioners have suggested that we use a brighter color for the cushion on the pews, but we don't want to accent the pews at all. We want to downplay them so that the focus of attention will be on the building itself. When we looked at computer models of brighter pew cushions, it had much the same effect as the orange cushions now have. Our idea is to downplay the pews and keep the color and focus elsewhere......Have you ever considered including your parish in your will? A bequest can be for a specific purpose or for the general use of the parish. At St. Patrick's, we have established the St. Patrick Foundation which exists solely for the ongoing maintenance of the church building. None of those funds can be used for any other purpose......Another way to include your parish is by naming your parish as a beneficiary to a life insurance policy. It is not easy maintaining the old buildings which are both St. Hedwig's and St. Patrick's, and a gift like these can make an amazing difference.....The new air-conditioning units will be installed in the church shortly. Be patient with them as they are going to stand out like a sore thumb until we have them faux finished to match the marble. Once they are done, you won't be able to see the difference. It may be several weeks before this can be done......A religion class teacher asked her first graders why Joseph and Mary took Jesus with them to Jerusalem and one little child answered, "They couldn't get a baby-sitter!".....The same teacher was discussing the Ten Commandments. After explaining the commandment to "Honor thy father and thy mother," she asked, "Is there a commandment that teaches us how to treat our brothers and sisters?" Without missing a beat, one little boy answered, "Thou shall not kill."




