



Today is the Second Sunday of Easter and our first reading comes from Acts of the Apostles. Recall that the first reading always comes from the Old Testament except during the Easter season when it comes from

Acts, the book written by St. Luke chronicling the life of the early church. Today's excerpt notes the signs and wonders which accompanied the apostles as they began to preach the gospel, first in Jerusalem but eventually to all of the then known world.

Our second reading is from the Book of Revelation, written by the author of John's gospel in a cave on the Greek Isle of Patmos. I have been to the cave on several occasions and you can actually go right into the area where John wrote. The literary style of his book is one which we do not have today and so it is often misunderstood. It is "apocalyptic literature" which was very popular for about four hundred years. It was always written to people facing persecution telling them in a strange series of codes that their suffering is about to end. John refers to the OT book of Daniel which is also apocalyptic and portrays God as sitting on a throne dressed in a flowing white robe. John is now dressing Christ this way to show that he is the Son of God.

Our gospel from John is the familiar story of the Doubting Thomas. It is late in the day of Easter and the disciples are frightened. Jesus appears and shows them his scars to show that he is truly the Jesus who was crucified. John has Jesus breathing on them and giving them the Holy Spirit, but Thomas is not present and finally his words of belief are followed by Jesus saving. "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed," a clear reference to the early second century audience to whom John was writing. He is encouraging them in their faith because they are the people who believe without seeing while experiencing persecution.

St. Patrick's School will again host an all school reunion for anyone who attended at any time. Last year's reunion, organized by John Maloney, was an overwhelming success, and John is hoping that this year's will follow. The reunion will be held on Saturday, July 6, at the Polish Falcons on East Third Street. Guests are then invited to attend the Sunday morning 10:30 AM Mass at St. Patrick's as a group.

We are in need of volunteers for this year's Irish Festival to assist with the Children's Area. The work would merely involve committing yourself to a time slot (usually 2 hours). We're wondering if some of the young new parishioners might be interested in helping with this project. The chair of that area will outline clearly what the task involves. Think about it for now and we'll start asking for volunteers to sign up in May.

With the growth of the crowds at last year's festival, we're anticipating the same for this year and are going to be in need of additional volunteers. The wait for registration last year on Saturday evening was extremely long and this year we're going to add additional registration tables. We're also going to set up two bars rather than the one we've had in the past, and we're adding an Irish Whiskey Tasting Booth.

The Festival Committee voted unanimously not to have vendors this year with the exception of our own local Tipperary West. We can then use that area for a second bar as well as additional seating. The grand prize again this year will be a week in Ireland for two.

Congratulations to St. Patrick parishioner Michele Wheaton who was recently honored as one of Erie's outstanding women by Mercyhurst. Michelle is extremely active in the parish serving as a member of the parish Finance Council, a lector, server and Eucharistic Minister at Mass. Michelle also almost singlehandedly puts together the annual St. Patrick's Day parade. She is also a member of the Knights and Ladies of St. Patrick.

If you've not yet participated in the Catholic Services Appeal, would you consider doing so? Each parish is assessed a certain amount which we must pay and anything earned above that can remain in the parish. We are far short of our goal in both parishes.

We are beginning work in church soon to make the women's restroom accessible to the southwest tower room. That is where bridal parties wait before a wedding and by cutting a doorway through the wall into the west restroom, they can have access to it. That involves our switching the restrooms and putting the men's on the east side and the women's on the west side.

#### From the Pastor's Desk continued......

Each restroom will also have a changing table. In addition to that work, we are putting a railing up in the choir loft. There is a railing in the center, but none on either side, so we are duplicating what is in the center and putting it on either side. I'm very grateful to a parishioner who is assuming the costs of new carpeting in the choir loft.

A good deal of work has been completed in the Food Pantry area. A new floor has been laid courtesy of the Erie Community Foundation, new entrance doors have been installed and a new restroom is in place. As an interesting aside, you might be amused to know that a baby was once born in St. Patrick's Church!!! Years ago, the custodian and his family lived in those back rooms which now serve as the Food Pantry, and his wife gave birth to a baby while living there!!! This place is full of surprises.

The family members of the young boy who drowned in the bay a few weeks ago are clients at our Food Pantry and I am impressed that our volunteers took up a collection among themselves to give to the family. Tragedy always has a way of bringing out the best in people. In addition, St. Patrick's Parish has made a sizeable donation to the Dusckas Funeral Home to help with the funeral cost.

Thank you for your generous contributions for the Easter collection.

Fred was hospitalized and dying so the family sent for the priest. As soon as the priest stood beside the bed, Fred began to fail and he flailed about as he tried to speak. He motioned frantically for something to write on so they handed him a note. Fred scrawled his message and stuffed it into the priest's hands. Moments later he died. The priest thought it best not to look at the note just then but to comfort the widow and so he put the note in his pocket. Several days later during the funeral homily, he realized that he was wearing the same suit that he wore the day Fred died. "You know," he said, "Fred handed me a note just before he died and I haven't read it yet, but let me share it with you because, knowing Fred, there are probably some words of inspiration which will help us get through this difficult time." Opening the note, the priest read aloud, "Get off my #@%&#@ oxygen tube!"

No matter how energized we feel, there is always something in our lives that we don't want to do. Whether it's as simple as taking out the garbage or as complicated as saying goodbye to a loved one. There are certain things that we tend to hide from. What we need is the right motivation or word of encouragement that will move us to action. This is where the apostles find themselves today and it is Jesus who provides the spark that they need. "Peace be with you" is a simple expression, but it is a motivating force. Jesus gives them the one thing they will need to overcome their fear and have courage to persevere—the Holy Spirit. The Easter peace is meant to be a motivating force for us as well. The Holy Spirit that we received in Baptism and again at Confirmation is with us today.
