



Today we celebrate the most solemn feast of the Christian year. Christ's conquest of death means that death no longer has a hold over us; but that the option for eternal life is ours for the asking.....Our first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles which is a continuation of Luke's gospel. The gospel ends with the ascension and Acts begins there and traces the early church for us. Today we hear the ever fumbling and foot-in-the-mouth Peter, and he is totally transformed by what has happened. We hear him speaking with uncharacteristic self-confidence and understanding. All the potential that Jesus obviously saw in him is now realized, transformed by the resurrection. His talk is a basic catechism of what has happened.....Our very brief second reading from Paul's letter to the Colossians in which he asks his audience to seek the things of above rather than the passing things of this world. He tells us that since we have been raised up by Christ we must now set our hearts on higher realms.....Our gospel comes today from John, and is his account of Easter morning. None of the gospels claim that anyone actually witnessed the resurrection but those who witnessed its aftermath were forever changed. Once again, we are told that Jesus first appeared to a woman, Mary Magdalene. When Peter and John run to the tomb after Mary tells them what has happened, John waits for Peter to go in first. Our excerpt today concludes with the line that they did not yet understand what has happened and what resurrection actually means.....While we celebrate the Ascension 40 days after Easter, most scholars are of the mind that both the resurrection and the ascension took place on the same day.....The parish office will be closed on Easter Monday.....I believe I mentioned to you that when we took up a corner of the carpet in the sanctuary we discovered that the carpet is glued to the marble floor. Marble is, of course, porous and hence it is completely ruined. It actually has an orange shade to it. We are now exploring the possibility to laying 20 inch square white glossy tiles for the sanctuary floor. We would then run a 12 inch border across the front of an emerald green tile. We would also like to take the area beneath the altar coming out about 2 feet all around it and make that also emerald green. We're exploring if we can do this and how it will effect the overall budget.....A special thanks to all who memorialized family and friends in the Easter flowers. Next Sunday's bulletin will contain a page of pictures of St. Patrick's decorated for Easter and the following Sunday will include color photographs of St. Hedwig's Easter celebration.....Please remember that the annual Communion breakfast will be held at St. Hedwig's on Sunday, April 29, immediately following the 9 AM Mass. Speaker will be Sister Phyllis Hilbert, SSJ.....At our meeting with the Conrad Schmitt people last week, we worked on a time table for the restoration. They are suggesting that we start using the Cauley Auditorium about the middle of August. At that time, all of the pews on the two side aisles will be removed and taken to be refinished. We will leave the center pews in place until August 27th because of weddings. Beginning August 15, however, they will begin erecting scaffold towers along both the east wall and the west wall of the building. As soon as the center pews are removed, several more towers will be erected. I'm told that they will run steel beams from the side towers to the center towers and then build a floor on the top of the structure so that they can begin by painting the dome and the ceiling first and then work down the walls. While that is going on, the Restoration Committee will monitor and work with the artists to make sure that things are done to our expectations. We did that with the two men who were here to do the mock-up and it worked well.....This time table depends, of course, on our raising the necessary money for the project. You will recall that the diocese requires that we have 50% of the needed funds in cash before we can begin.....Chip Wachter, a member of the Restoration Committee and I went through the Cauley Auditorium last week with people from Erie Insurance. They have removed all of the tile flooring that was in the building because it was so full of asbestos, so we're going to be on concrete. We have about 135 chairs and will rent what additional ones we need. We will move the altar and the pulpit from the weekday chapel into the Cauley. There is also a small organ in the weekday chapel that can be moved over there. Grise is going to design a temporary sound system for us to use.....As I mentioned earlier, we will have our weekday Masses in the chapel in the rectory, our funerals will be held at St. Hedwig's and no ceremonies of any kind will be held in the church. The Conrad Schmitt people tell me that if they can get started by that time, they will be finished for Christmas. Our goal is to open the building for the first time for the Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve and allow everyone an opportunity to see it even as it is decorated for Christmas.....These are exciting moments for the parish, but also moments that require a great deal of patience and understanding. The Cauley is not the most elegant building in town and it's going to be uncomfortable for us to have Mass in there. But that should help make our return to the church all the more appreciated.....The Irish Festival Committee, under the chair of Cal Pifer, is meeting regularly and working on plans for the festival. Planned for September 14, 15 & 16, the committee is suggesting a few changes in the venue, some changes that are exciting. We've been very fortunate to secure Erie Insurance as THE major sponsor of the festival with a very generous gift to the parish—the largest sponsorship we've ever had for the festival. As we get closer to the date, we're going to be looking for a good number of volunteers, and I hope you'll join in. Calamari's is once more going to do the food for us.....An ad found in a British newspaper: "For Sale by Owner: Complete set of Encyclopedia Britannica, 45 volumes, excellent condition, 200 pounds or best offer.
