



Today is Palm Sunday, the beginning of the most solemn week of the church year. We begin with the solemn blessing of palms and the reading of our gospel account of Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem. It seems incredulous that a crowd could be so wel-

coming today and then turn so against Jesus by Friday and yet Jesus is knowledgeable enough of the OT prophet Isaiah to know that a faithful servant is usually a suffering servant. Remember that Matthew is writing to a Jewish audience and he is quoting the OT prophet Zechariah in noting that Jesus arrives riding on an ass, a colt. Luke and Mark make no mention of Zechariah but Mt has to. Again in the gospel, the reference to the Mount of Olives comes from Zechariah as the place where the Messiah would come to deliver Jerusalem from her enemies.

Our first reading is taken from Isaiah's Suffering Servant songs in which God's servant embraces a thankless ministry that's doomed to failure, and yet the words are a prayer of thanks for a ministry both privileged and burdensome. Aware of the hardships he faces, the servant declares God to have tutored him to speak a word to the weary that will rouse them. The early church readily saw the connection between this suffering servant of Isaiah and Jesus, a reality which has been largely lost on us today.

Our second reading is one of the most ancient hymns in the church. A key to understanding it is in its structure. The first half up to "death on the cross" refers to Christ, telling us who he isequal with God, born as a man, humble and obedient. But in the second half, the subject becomes God and we learn what he has done for Christ: exalted him, given him the name above every other, etc. The text invites us to imitate Christ who in humble obedience embraced the cruelest of deaths, but it also reminds us that God's kingdom is a place of reversals. "Because of this" is the key hinge in today's hymn; because Jesus was obedient, he is glorified.

Our Gospel is the Passion from Matthew. Each year we read two different versions (and they are dramatically different). Today from the gospel of the year and Friday always from John. Unlike John's Jesus whose kingship is acknowledged by Pilate three times, Matthew's Jesus is only

recognized after his death when a non-Jew, a Roman centurion declares, "Truly this was the son of God." The reversal of God's kingdom we heard in our second reading only comes to Jesus after total abandonment by friends and followers. In contrast to last year's Passion from Luke, his disciples come off badly; they fall asleep three times, they desert him, Judas betrays him and Peter denies him. And from the cross, rather than Luke's beautiful words of forgiveness, Matthew's Jesus cries in agony, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" There is no other passion account as full of sorrow and sadness as is Matthew's. From the earliest days of the church, the passion accounts were always read as one continuous story; never broken into smaller gospel accounts.

This week is the most solemn week of the church year, and I hope you will find some time to pull away from the hectic pace of life and spend it in conversation with our God. Our schedule for the week is contained elsewhere in today's bulletin, and again I invite you to take advantage of the various Holy Week services. All of the Holy Week liturgies will be held at St. Patrick's.

On Holy Thursday, the only Mass allowed in Catholic parishes is the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence in which Catholics are asked not to eat meat and eat only one full meal and two smaller meals. There is no Mass on Good Friday. only the Commemoration of the Lord's Passion with the distribution of Communion. While confessions can be heard on that day, no other sacraments can. We cannot have a funeral, etc. The Holy Water fonts are also emptied because Christ has died and we wait for the blessing of the new holy water on Holy Saturday. On that day Mass cannot begin before sundown and Bishop Persico has informed us this year that no Masses begin before 9 PM.

We have started a program to help parents of a new baby by providing a few nights of meals for them. The project is being chaired by Abby Lechner, and we're in need of additional volunteers. If you would be able to help by just providing one meal for a couple who are new parents, please call the parish office and Abby will be in touch with you.

From the Pastor's Desk continued......

The parish office will be closed Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Monday. I will be here in case of an emergency.

The only Easter Vigil will be celebrated on Holy Saturday at 9 PM at St. Patrick's. .

To date, we have CSA pledges at St. Patrick's for \$56,355 toward our assessment of \$42,000. Remember that any extra monies raised stay in the parish and I hope to use it toward paying down the debt on the restoration of the church. A total of 116 families have pledged so far. If you have not yet made a pledge, please do so. At St. Hedwig's, our goal is \$11,000 and we have pledges of \$6,075.00.

I'm need of some good workers for a special project. We want to build a 20' x 20' stage for the Irish Festival. To rent the stage and dance floor each year will cost over \$1,500. If we invest in one, then we can store it and use it each year. Holy Trinity has graciously told us we can use their 20' x 20' dance floor, so we should be set. I'm hoping we can build the stage in at least 3 sections which would interlock, so that we can easily take it apart to store. The stage needs to be 12 inches high. The Festival will purchase all of the materials; I just need a couple of parishioners who might be interested in helping with this. Participation carries with it heavy discounts in the confessional and access to the beer keg in the rectory!!

This past Tuesday we hosted Bishop Persico, Jeff Rouse and 54 people from the Diocese of Greensburg who came to see the Stations and share lunch with Bishop Persico. Jeff Rouse is the man who restored the Stations and continues to keep a close eye on them. We hosted them for Stations and then lunch in the rectory.

A wife invited some people to dinner. At the table she turned to her five year old daughter and said, "Would you like to say the blessing?" The little girl replied, "I don't know what to say." "Just say what you hear mommy say, sweetheart," the mother answered. The daughter bowed her head and prayed, "Dear Lord, why on earth did I invite all these people to dinner?"





Reading I: Isaiah 50: 4-7

Reading II: Philippians 2: 6-11 Gospel: Matthew 26: 14-27: 66



In today's gospel we have reached the point where Jesus' teaching and example were at critical odds with the culture of the Jewish chief priests and elders. They are offended by his cleansing of the temple and some perceived him as a threat to their status quo. Their plot against Jesus was facilitated first by Judas' betrayal and then by the desertion of the disciples. Jesus remained alone, approaching his death with total surrender to his Father's will. We can model his compassion, generosity, and forgiveness. How has being faithful to Christ helped you to die to yourself?
