#### From the Pastor's Desk.....

Today is the Sixth Sunday after Easter and we read again from Acts of the Apostles. Chapters 10 and 11 narrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Gentiles. For Luke, the descent and presence of the Holy Spirit onto Jews, Gentiles and Samaritans emphasizes the universal aspect of salvation, for the God of Israel now offers it to the world. The reason for the shift is best explained in Peter's words: In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him. Luke goes to great length to show the high number of Gentiles joining the church. He also feels it important to show that the two leading apostles, Peter and Paul, were both open to including Gentiles. Though Peter was much slower in coming to recognize this, Paul evidences it in some of his letters, written in the mid-50s. Acts was not written until the mid 80s.

In the early Johannine community, the gospel of John and the three letters (authored by someone else) are the core of their belief which can be summed up in love. God's love was revealed in the incarnation of his son and in his sacrifice on the cross. From this divine initiative, believers are called to respond in a very concrete way: "Love one another."

Today's gospel is a continuation of last Sunday's where Jesus speaks of himself as the "vine" and we as his "branches." We remain as his branches if we keep his commandments. He speaks of his great love for us in laying down his life "for one's friends." This use of "friends" is unique to John's gospel. It will be reiterated in Jesus asking Peter three times "Do you love me?" The whole vine and branches section of the gospel concludes with Jesus directing his disciples to "bear fruit." Earlier in the discourse bearing fruit refers to faith in him; and here he extends that

directive to be "Love one another."

St. Patrick's choir, greeters, offertory counters, Homeless Shelter leadership, etc. will gather on Monday evening at the Watson/Curtze mansion for a 2 hour cocktail party. It's an opportunity for us to get to know one another better. Because parking is very limited at the mansion, people are asked to park at St. Patrick's Church and the trolley will circle around from the church to the mansion and back all evening.

Thursday of this week is the Feast of the Ascension, a holy day of obligation. Mass at St. Patrick's will be on Thursday at 12:05 PM.

I received a letter two weeks ago from the bishop's office informing me that my six year term as your pastor will expire on November 3, 2015. I have asked Bishop Persico if he will give me a second six year term as your pastor. As part of that request, I will be evaluated by the members of the Parish Council and Finance Council. Those persons are Tom Cook, Dario Cipriani, Michele Wheaton, Mary Pat Schlaudecker and Mary Kearney. I am also asked to submit 5 names of parishioners who would be willing to assess my abilities as your pastor. The diocese will then select five people who contributed to the Catholic Services Appeal and ask them to evaluate me. Once those are compiled, the bishop will meet with me and share his decision.

If I am granted a second six year term as your pastor, I will reach my 75th birthday during that term (I am now 72) which is the expected age of retirement. Bishop Persico asked all of us who are over the age of 65 what our intentions are when we turn 75. I told him quite honestly that retirement scares me. If I had a family, it would be different; but what would I do all day long? I told him that as long as my health is good and I can get away a few times a year for travel, I would

prefer to continue as pastor. If we reach that point, you will each be asked to vote anonymously whether you think I should continue as pastor or whether you think you need a younger man to run the parish. Part of the problem is that you're too good to me and why would I want to leave?

Congratulations to Michael Easter and Paige Parisi who were married at Saint Patrick's this weekend. Congratulations also to Brielle Christina Reilly, daughter of Sean & Colleen Ryan Reilly who was baptized last Sunday.

Pope Francis recently ordained 15 new priests and in his homily he told them "don't dress up like peacocks, don't give boring homilies and don't ever refuse baptism to anyone who asks for it."

The St. Patrick Food Pantry distributed 24,118 pounds of food in March at a cost to the parish of \$767. The total number of families was down rather significantly from over 900 to 755. Among those served were 1,065 children, 462 elderly.

The Leadership of the Roar on the Shore motor-cycle parade have asked to end the event in front of St. Patrick's Church on Thursday, July 16, at 1 PM. They have also requested that we have the church open so that their members can see the interior of the building. As was done last year, a number of local women religious from the various communities will ride in side cars in the parade.

Instruct your children to never give out personal information online. This includes their addresses, telephone number, the

A simple picture of your daughter in a cheerleading uniform, standing in front of your house, could provide enough information for a stranger to physical locate her. Online predators have ways to innocently ask simple questions over a period that gives them enough information to know who children are and where they live.
