



Today is the Feast of the Ascension in most of the world; but in our area, we celebrated it last Thursday and so today is the 7th Sunday of Easter. Again we hear from Acts of the Apostles about Stephen. He had earlier in the book been chosen by

the apostles to handle the administration of the community so they would be free to preach. He was apparently an outstanding preacher and preached Jesus Christ to the Sanhedrin which infuriated them. As Luke describes Stephen's martyrdom, he goes to great length to make it clear that it is a mirror of Jesus' ministry. His words, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit," and "Lord do not hold this sin against them" are the very words uttered by Jesus in Luke's gospel. Luke then very cleverly says that Stephen "fell asleep," to indicate that he is not dead, but is with the Risen Christ in heaven. It is in this section of Acts, that Luke introduces Saul to us as one who had been persecuting Christians.

Continuing from the Book of Revelation, today John is having a vision in which Jesus, as God, speaks. We know the speaker to be Jesus because he identifies himself as "the Alpha and the Omega," the exact attributes assigned to God in the opening of this book. Here we have Jesus telling John he is coming soon, which is great comfort to John's persecuted audience. Not only is he coming, but he assures his readers that those who are persecuting them will be held accountable. John's extensive symbolism in this book has a bride portrayed who says, "Come." She stands for the redeemed community of the church. As the reading ends, the victorious Jesus promises "I am coming soon," to which the community responds, "Come, Lord Jesus."

Our gospel again comes from John and is the conclusion of the long prayer that Jesus utters at his last meal with the disciples. He prays not only for the disciples, but for those who will believe in him through their word, ie, he's praying for us. John develops two main thoughts in this prayer. First, that the disciples remain united to one another and secondly, that this necessary unity is established through love. As the Father and Jesus love one another, so does Jesus love his disciples and they, in turn, are to love one another. It is all about unity and love. Some young mothers at St. Patrick's are wondering if other young mothers would like to form a group to meet for a few hours every week or so to talk about raising their children, their Catholic faith, etc. If there is an interest, would there be some others in the parish who might be interested in giving these young mothers a break and coming to the rectory to babysit for an hour or so while they meet with their peers? If interested, please contact the parish office and we'll get back in touch with you.

Today is Mother's Day and all of your mothers, both living and deceased, are remembered in our Masses. Our bulletin contains an insert listing the names of all of your mothers, both living and deceased, whom you wish to be particularly remembered in Masses today.

Please keep Bishop Persico and the diocesan leadership in your prayers as we begin the process of parish reconfiguration. You may have read Bishop Persico's letter in a recent bulletin which outlines his plans for this to be a broadly based consultative process involving laity and clergy. He makes it clear that this will not be some type of a mandate, but that input from everyone will help us determine how best to utilize our resources. We simply cannot continue with so many parishes, most of whom are in debt and unable to pay their bills. In addition, we simply don't have the priests nor the resources to staff them as well as people sitting in the pews. We will all feel a tinge of sadness when the reconfiguration is announced, but we also know that it is necessary.

There is some real anxiety that one of our parishes will be on the list, and I ask you to suspend those feelings—and any silly rumors until we know better what direction all of this will take. To assume anything now is to put the cart before the horse. Let's all participate in the process to make our church stronger, more effective and more capable of utilizing our limited resources. There are no simple answers, but together, focused on the Word of God and our faith tradition, we'll plan for the future. One of the real failings of our diocese is that there is no planning in place, no Office of Planning to help us determine in what directions we should be moving. and move forward.

From the Pastor's Desk continued......

As the debate on immigration moves to center stage in America, it is important to understand the impact of immigration on the American Catholic church. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles, the largest in the US, is now 71% Latino in population. The Archdiocese of New York and the Archdiocese of Chicago, the second and third largest in the US, are now each 52% Hispanic. Fully 60% of US Catholics under the age of 30 are Hispanic. All of this is bringing about a major change in the face of the American Church. There are a very large number of dioceses which will now not ordain a man a priest until he is fluent both in English and Spanish and more and more diocesan newspapers are publishing in both languages. I was recently in Washington, DC and stopped at St. Matthew's Cathedral. I noticed that of the five weekend Masses, two of them are in Spanish. While incredibly high numbers of Anglo Catholics have left the church in the past twenty years, even larger numbers of Latinos and Hispanics Catholics have joined the church. When I was stationed in the Diocese of San Bernardino, CA, I was stunned at how Latino the local church had become. Latino piety, etc. have moved to center stage. December 10th is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadaloupe and each year tens and tens of thousands of Hispanics would not go to work or to school that day so that they could participate in a twenty mile procession honoring Mary. While our Diocese has designated St. Stephen's Parish as a Latino parish, we will probably see growth in this area in the future.

If anyone in St. Patrick's Parish is involved in the home security business, could you give me a call. Because of some recent incidents we are adding a security camera to record who enters and leaves the church as well as one which will record who is entering or leaving the rectory.
