



Problems and challenges ride the same train as success. The opening statement in today's first reading heralds the amazing growth in the number of disciples, but it also signals the start of tension resulting from that success. Some of the Greek disciples

complain that their widows are not being cared for as well as others. The Twelve immediately take action and appoint seven men who will be ordained deacons and assigned the responsibility of caring for the physical needs of the community. This was the role of the deacon in the early church—to care for the sick, the needy, those imprisoned, etc. The reference in the last line to priests is to Jewish priests; remember we will not have ordained priests in Christianity until well into the third century.

Using a well developed image, Peter is teaching us about church in our second reading. Christ is the "living stone," an image borrowed from Psalm 118. Because we are his followers, we, too, are living stones that can be built into a spiritual house. But Peter points out that the stone which becomes our cornerstone, the foundation of our faith, can become a stumbling stone for nonbelievers. In the closing verses, Peter uses a number of Old Testament images to make his point: "chosen race," "royal priesthood," "holy nation," "a people of his own" and he now applies these to Christian believers.

Shakespeare not withstanding, parting is not always such sweet sorrow. For Jesus and his disciples it is frustrating and frightening. The moment painfully illustrates that a teacher rarely is certain that his work is done and that students now know all they need to know. Much to the contrary, Jesus is confronted with the lack of understanding that seems to amaze and trouble him. Jesus is aware of the disciples mood and so he begins with (and 27 verses later will repeat) the admonition "do not let your hearts be troubled." He tells them they know the way that leads where I am going but Thomas expresses doubt again. Jesus makes very clear assertions about his identity. He has not come to show us a way, but to be the way. He did not come to teach the truth, but to be the truth. He does not just give life; he is life. The exchange with Philip is much more poignant that the dialogue with Thomas. When he asks "Show us the father," Jesus will

respond with disappointment. "Philip," he asks, "do you not know me even after so long a time?" Philip and the others clearly have much more to learn and so Jesus, like a teacher reviewing the lesson for the fourth time, launches into his explanation. "I am in the Father and the Father is in me," he tells them. The passage ends telling us that we who believe will do even greater deeds than these disciples.

Our capital campaign for the restoration of the church continues to come in at a wonderful rate. With total pledges of \$1,124,926, to date we have payments of \$887,203. I had been making payments on the loan from the diocese at the rate of \$10,000 per month plus interest, but since January I have been making payments of \$20,000 per month plus interest.

The response to our Catholic Services Appeal has been likewise very good at St. Patrick's. With an assessment of \$42,000, we have pledges of \$59,800 which allows me an additional \$17,000 that I can apply toward the debt. Thank you for your generosity.

It is customary on Holy Thursday to leave the church open following the Mass of the Lord's Supper until usually around 10 PM so that people can come and pray before the Blessed Sacrament. We have been doing that at St. Patrick's. but we're not going to do it next year. This year we only had 5 people stop. People just don't come downtown at that hour of the night, so we will not leave the church open next year.

Now that the weather has broken we are going to resume working on the exterior of the rectory. You may recall we discovered three years ago that most of the mortar between the bricks has deteriorated. There are some places on the building where there is no mortar left at all. To date we have done the exterior of the first floor and now going to start on the second floor. The east side of the house is perfectly fine, but the south,

north and west sides (which get the weather) are badly in need of work. We're also going to have to start painting the trim on the house as it is in need of it.

Congratulations to Chloe Boorady who recently made her First Communion and will be recognized at today's 10:30 Mass. Congratulations also to Gemma Filippi who made her First Communion last Sunday at the Cathedral and will also be recognized at today's 10:30 Mass.

You will notice that the leak high on the east wall of St. Patrick's Church has completely stopped. Gary James discovered that there was water coming through the mortar and said to give that area 4-6 months to completely dry out before we repaint it. As such, we can get it repainted sometime this summer. That has been the sight of a chronic leak for years and it was always assumed the water was coming in through the roof somewhere and then traveling to that spot. I'm glad that they finally discovered exactly where the problem lie because it is now corrected. Later in the summer we will touch up that area.

Sister Marie is going to work this summer with several children who want to come into the church and are in need of preparation. We also have a larger than normal group of adults who want to come into the church next Easter Vigil and she will start having regular classes with them. If you know of anyone else who is interested, please contact Sister Marie so we can get them enrolled in the program.

Reading I: Acts 6:1-7

Reading II: Peter 2:4-9

Gospel: John 14:1-12
