



Today is the feast of the Holy Trinity and our first reading comes from the OT Book of Proverbs, the only time this year we will read from that book. It is part of a collection of "wisdom litera-Iture" and was intended to teach people how to be wise in relating to God

and one another. The book contains a series of lengthy instructional poems from which today's reading is taken as well as a section of "proverbs" or brief wise sayings. Today we hear part of a speech by Wisdom, personified as a character who speaks first of her deep union with God from the beginning citing herself as the firstborn of all creation, even before the creation of the world. In the second half, she describes her role in creation and she tells us she participated as God's craftsman.

Our second reading is from Paul's Letter to the Romans, and we again encounter Paul's lengthy sentence structure. Today's reading is composed of only two sentences. He begins by telling us we are justified, or saved, by faith. This leads us to hope, the second effect of our relationship with God through Jesus Christ. Paul tells us that we can boast of our salvation, but that we can also boast of our afflictions, something he does throughout his writings.

Our Gospel comes again from John and is part of the Last Supper discourse which Jesus gave after Judas left. He reveals to them that he will send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit. He begins by noting that the disciples aren't capable of understanding everything yet, but they need to know that he will not abandon them. Jesus identifies the Spirit as truth. In John's gospel, truth is used as a reference to Jesus. He is telling them that this Spirit will do everything in reference to Jesus. In the final sentence he affirms the intimate communion that exists between him and the Father and extends this communion to the disciples.

I know you welcome Father Dennis Martin, chaplain at Saint Vincent Health Center, as celebrant of the Saturday evening 5 PM Mass at St. Patrick's, and Monsignor Richard Sullivan, retired pastor of St. Andrew's as celebrant of the Sunday 9 AM at St. Hedwig's and the 10:30 AM at St. Patrick's. I am in England and will return on Tuesday.

A reminder that starting next Sunday, June 2, we will add an 8 AM Mass each Sunday during June, July and August at St. Patrick's. A number of people have requested this for the summer months, and I'm happy to oblige. We'll determine whether we continue in the winter months depending upon the attendance. There will not be any music at this Mass because I have to get to St. Hedwig's for the 9 AM Mass and then back to St. Patrick's for the 10:30 AM Mass. I think I'll skip the gym on Mondays; that's enough exercise in one day for a 70 year old man!!!

Monday is Memorial Day and the parish office will be closed.

There is a new report on ordinations to the priesthood in the US which show that in 1965, 995 men were ordained. In 2012, 497 were ordained. When I was ordained in 1970, I was 28 years old, 2 years older than my classmates. The average age of a new priest today is 35.5. Three in ten ordinands were born outside the United States with the largest number coming from Mexico, Vietnam, Columbia, Poland and the Philippines. A full 62% report that they held a full time job before entering the seminary and 48% report that they were discouraged from entering the seminary, usually by a sibling, a friend or a classmate.

One of the items Bishop Persico wants to carefully explore in a reconfiguration of the diocese is a projection of how many priests there will be in five years and 10 years. When I was ordained in 1970, I was Erie priest #305; today we have 120 in ministry and the median age has skyrocketed.

Continuing a tradition begun in 1902, St. Stanislaus Parish will host their annual Outdoor Procession on the Feast of Corpus Christi, June 2nd. The procession will begin at 3 PM in church. The public is invited.

On the Feast of Corpus Christi, June 2, we will reinitiate Communion under both species at St. Patrick's for those who wish to receive both the bread and the wine. There will be just two Eucharistic Ministers for the cup—they will be positioned between the people distributing hosts and the main aisle. Reception of the wine is optional and we had discontinued it because of the danger of spreading the flu but will now resume it.

From the Pastor's Desk continued......

Because of some recent incidents, we are installing a security camera which will show us who is entering St. Patrick's Church as well as one which will show us who is entering the rectory.

Please note the announcement of a second reunion for all who attended St. Patrick's School.

Erie Insurance told me last week that the demolition of the Cauley Auditorium will take place at some point in June. I think I told you that the south wall of the building is buckling so bad that it can't be saved. Erie Insurance knew that when they bought the building from us, and were also gracious enough to let us use the building for 5 months while the church was being restored. Once the building is demolished, the area is going to be preserved as a small park with grass, trees and benches.

We've run into some roof problems with St. Patrick's Church and are having two sections of the tile completely replaced. I didn't have this in the budget, but we simply can't delay the work. If water were to begin to seep into the interior of the building, all of our work would be for naught.

Then I got married, we had a bunch of puppies and now I'm retired." The guy is amazed, goes back to the owner and asks what he wants for the dog. "Ten dollars," he replies. "Ten dollars. Why would you sell him so cheap?" he asks. "Because he's full of bs. He's never been out of the yard."


Catholic Services Appeal Update
