



Today is the Feast of the Holy Trinity when we pause to reflect on the various roles of the Father, Son and Spirit in promising us salvation and bringing it to fulfillment provided we are willing to listen and be attentive to the way the Spirit nudges us. Our first reading is from the Book of Deuteronomy. Moses is fighting the human tendency to forget. With great oratorical skills he share his profound awareness of the marvels God worked for Israel in an effort to awaken their drowsy memories and fuel in them the sense of awe that burns in him. He urges them to survey all of history and see if anything like what our God has done was ever done before. He concludes by reminding his audience that fidelity to our God is tantamount. So much depends upon this fidelity—prosperity, long life, land- that living our commitment is hardly an option.....Our second brief reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans joyfully proclaims that we are children of God and he urges us to live like we believe that. Baptism gives us permission to call God "Father." Remember that in the Old Testament, a faithful Jew would never mention God's name—to do so would be to call him present—and they never referred to him by name. This transition given to us now is a major change for the Israelites. But Paul reminds us that a willingness to suffer with Christ is essential to our enjoying this new status.....Our Gospel comes from Matthew (remember that we are reading this year from Mark. Prior to the renewal of the liturgy with Vatican II we never read from Mark, over 90% of the Sunday gospels came from Matthew with only occasional gospels from John and Luke). We are experiencing a strange moment for the disciples. Note that there are only 11 of them, that they are climbing a mountain and in the Old Testament God was always revealed on top of a mountain, so the expectation is here today. Though some of the disciples, we're told, are still filled with doubt, they make the journey. When Jesus comes to them, he speaks with authority and tells them to go, convert people, baptize, teach and he assures them that he is with them through everything they do in his name. The reference to Father, Son and Holy Spirit is probably the reason this reading was chosen for today's feast of the Holy Trinity......A recent report from the Association of Statisticians of American Religious Bodies zeroes in our neighboring diocese of Buffalo where ten years ago the percentage of the population affiliated with a faith tradition was higher than in any other metropolitan area in the country. But while total population of the Buffalo area fell 3% over the ten year period (34,000 people), membership in religious traditions fell by 31% or 260,000 people! According to the census, Catholicism in the area lost a third of its members—217,944 parishioners. Not only Catholicism but mainline Protestant denominations and Judaism suffered stunning losses during the period. Membership in the Episcopal church in the area fell by more than 38% to 8,612, and both the United Church of Christ and the Presbyterian Church fell by more than 30 percent. At the same time, the number of Muslims in the area increased by 242% (nationally the number of Muslims increased 67% during that period). There are presently 2.6 million Muslims in the United States while Buffalo registers 18,483 giving it a larger population in the area than Judaism with 8,084 members. And again, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, the Mormons, increased their membership in the area by 42% giving it a population of 3,373.....Following our recent trip to France, several people have asked about future trips. A September Mediterranean cruise is already completely booked. In May 2013, we are doing a 10-nite tour of the Alps starting with the German Alps, then the Austrian Alps and ending up in the Dolomites (the Italian Alps). In September 2013, we are doing 3 days in London and then a 7-nite Princess cruise of the British Isles which will include stops in Waterford, Dublin, Glasgow, etc. If interested in obtaining information as it becomes available, call the parish office and leave contact information including an e-mail address......Have you made your pledge to the Saint Patrick's Restoration Fund? We need everyone's help in order to complete this monumental task. I hope you'll join us in supporting the effort. We are in the process now of meeting with the diocese for the final approval to go forward; but I can't do that unless we have a response from everyone. Some of you are not able to support this appeal, and I understand that, but if we could just get a response, then we'll know exactly where we are. We are presently at 2/3 of our \$1 million goal, and we need your help for this final push. If we get the pledges, we can start in August and be back in the church no later than Christmas Eve......This past week, Erie Insurance hosted a several hour workshop for members of the downtown community to determine cooperation between neighbors in the event of a disaster. The goal of the meeting was to establish relationships between neighbors in our neighborhood so that we could form mutual aid agreements before they are needed. Once again, Erie Insurance takes the leadership in improving life in our neighborhood......During the past few weeks I hosted the couples who are going to be married at St. Patrick's this summer to dinner at St. Patrick's rectory. What fun evenings those were getting to know these couples a bit better and watching them interact with one another. After all, they're all in pretty much the same boat as they prepare for their upcoming big day. The number of weddings here is down dramatically this year because of the church restoration.....While driving in southern Pennsylvania, a family caught sight of an Amish carriage. The owner obviously had a sense of humor because attached to the back of the carriage was a hand-printed sign: "Energy efficient vehicle. Runs on oats and grass. Caution: Do not step in the exhaust.".....Attending a wedding for the first time, a little girl whispered to her mother, "Why is the bride dressed all in white?" The mother replied, "Because white is the color of happiness, and today is the happiest day of her life." The little girl thought about this for a minute and then asked, "So why is the groom wearing black?"
