#### From the Pastor's Desk.....

Today is Corpus Christi, Latin for the Body of Christ and we celebrate the gift of his body and blood as life-sustaining foods for eternity. In our first reading from the Book of Exodus we learn of God establishing a relationship with Moses, but just with him; God did this with Abraham but with an entire nation of people. The relationship was to be centered on the Law. The Torah is the teachings, the instructions that Moses received on Mt. Sinai. The Torah consists of the first five books of the Old Testament: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy. Not only did they contain the law, but the stories of Israel's ancestors such as Sara and Abraham, Joseph and his brothers, the forty years wandering in the desert. There were lessons to be learned from these stories. Central to living the law was the practice of offering sacrifice including animals such as young bulls. The blood was carefully drained from the animal and some of it splashed on the altar while the rest was poured into bowls and sprinkled on the people. This ritual became known as the Blood of the Covenant.

While the author of the letter to the Hebrews is unknown, the audience were Jewish Christians. One of the aims of the letter was to make sense of Jesus' death on the cross. Hebrews draws a sharp contrast between blood of goats and calves which was a Jewish ritual repeated annually and Jesus' blood shed once for all.

Mark gives us the earliest account of the Last Supper, but we know that even in Paul's letters (written 50-60 AD, twenty years before Mark) we have similar accounts. It is clear that certain aspects of the final week in Jesus' life were carefully preserved and recorded. Chief among these were Jesus' last words at the Last Supper. Paul tells the Christians in Corinth in 55 AD about the tradition he received of Jesus instituting the

Eucharist at the Last Supper. In both First Corinthians and Mark we hear Jesus' fourfold action of taking break, blessing it, breaking it and giving it to them. "Take it; this is my body." In a similar way he took the cup of wine and said "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many." Mark connects all of this to the Passover Lamb about to be sacrificed in the Old Testament

The new Pew Report on Christianity in America is rather frightening. The percentage of adults who describe themselves as Christian dropped by nearly eight percentage points in just seven years to 71 percent. At the same time, the share of those who are not affiliated with a religion jumped from 16 percent to 23 percent in the same time period. The older generation of millennials (born between 1981 and 1989) are becoming even less affiliated with religion as they grow older. In 2007, 25% of them did not affiliate with a religion; that number is now 34%. There are more religiously unaffiliated Americans (23%) than Catholics (21%) and Protestants (15%). A whooping 13% of all Americans were raised Catholic but are no longer Catholic. There are 3 million fewer Catholics today than in 2007. The most startling finding according to those who did the survey is the continuing religious disaffiliation among older cohorts.

The section of that survey which dealt with Catholics only show that for every convert to Catholicism in the US, there are six former Catholics. The majority of U. S. adults (85.6%) say they were raised as Christian. But more than a fifth of them (19.2%) no longer identify with Christianity. Hindus and Muslims are the only religions in America which are retaining their membership and, in some instances, growing. In 2007, 68% of respondents who were raised Catholic continued as such as adults. Today, that percentage has dropped to 59% who still identify with Catholicism

while 41% do not. And finally, one in five people who were raised Catholic now say they have no religious affiliation at all. These are certainly sobering statistics.

Mike Litzinger has served as director of our Food Pantry for the past 16 years and has done an incredible job. The Food Pantry would never be where it is today had it not been for his leadership. Noting that he is now 73 and has a long neglected bucket list, he has resigned that position. I know I speak for all of the Food Pantry volunteers in thanking him for his leadership and in wishing him well.

We are getting bids to replace some more of the sidewalk in front of St. Patrick's Church. We've been doing a section each year and hopefully we can finish up next year.

The Catholic Service Appeal drive at St. Patrick's is now at \$88,100.00. Only \$12,000 to go!!!!

Representatives of St. Hedwig and St. Patrick's parishes were among other Erie parishes this past week for another session in the diocesan strategic planning. This session was a report on the earlier discussions, the survey taken on line, etc. Since the bulletin is printed before the session, I'll give you an update next week.

The "Last Rites" was abolished by Vatican II and more correctly replaced with the Sacrament for the Sick. It is an anointing that should be given to anyone who is seriously ill or quite elderly. At all of the local hospitals, anyone undergoing surgery is given the sacrament. Many times families wait to call for the priest until someone is hovering at death's door. I'm not blaming anyone—that is what you were taught. However, that has changed and we shouldn't wait so long. If someone in your family is seriously ill or elderly, please call the office and I will come and anoint them.

Sister was teaching her first grade class the parable of the Good Samaritan. She asked the class, "If you saw someone lying on the roadside, all wounded and bleeding, what would you do?" Little Mary in the third row raised her hand and said, "I think I'd throw up."


