



Today we celebrate the great Feast of Pentecost and the coming of the Holy Spirit. We will use the readings from the day with our first reading from Acts of the Apostles. It de-

scribes the chaos as thunder, wind and fire come to bring the Holy Spirit. The other phenomenon is that they can understand different languages that are being spoken.

In our second reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians we hear him writing to a divided community splintered by the very reality that should be the source of their unity-the Holy Spirit. We read of Jew and Greek, slave and free brought together by the fearful noise of the Holy Spirit. In Corinth, God's generosity had divided the community. All received gifts, but instead of rejoicing with each other, they compared their gift to that of others, feeling blessed or short changed. He reminds them that, like parts of the body, gifts can't be ranked. The body, whether human or mystical, works only when all the parts labor in harmony. Each part has its own task and unless it is done well, the body suffers. Gifts can bring out the best or the worst in others. The worst is jealousy and rivalry, and that's what happened in Corinth. They forgot that gifts, though given to individuals, are to be exercised as forms of service for all. Paul obviously has great affection for the Corinthians and desires their harmony.

In our gospel it is the day of the resurrection and the disciples are hiding fearfully behind locked doors when unexpectedly and miraculously, Jesus comes and offers them peace. They are baffled and wonder if indeed this is the Lord. They seem not to recognize his face, but know it is him by his pierced hands and side. Once the disciples respond to him, Jesus repeats his greeting of peace. "As the Father has sent me" is meant as much to comfort as to commission. He assures them that just as the Father empowered him to do his work, so will he empower them. In John's gospel, the word "breathed" is his description of Pentecost and the coming of the Holy Spirit. It is intended to remind us of the imparting of life at creation. Note also that John places the Feast of Pentecost on the same day as the Resurrection. While we separate all of these feasts for liturgical reasons, most scripture scholars feel that the time between the Resurrection, the

Ascension and Pentecost was very brief, perhaps all of it happening on the same day.

CARA (Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate) at Catholic University has released a study on the ordination class of 2014. The report shows that only 477 men are being ordained in the US this year and their average age is 34 (when I was ordained, the average age was 25). Thirty one percent are from outside the United States with the majority coming from Mexico, Vietnam, Columbia, Poland or the Philippines, Interestingly, over 41% of the ordinands this year served in the military. While 71% said that their parish pastor encouraged them to consider priesthood, only 1% said that a military chaplain encouraged them. The highest degree of discouragement came from peers and from other family members but not a parent. About 10% were discouraged by their parents.

Another interesting aspect of the report shows that 70% of this year's ordination class pray the Rosary, 73% participate in Eucharistic Devotion but only 45% participate in any type of Bible Study. That's a disturbing statistic as you would hope and think that 100% of them would participate in Bible Study. On the contrary, this year's ordination class is overwhelmingly into private devotion over biblical studies.

With the recent retirement of Msgr. McSweeney & Msgr. McGee for health reasons, the retirement of Father Joseph Gregorek from Gannon and the resignation of the pastor of Our Lady of Peace, we are now down to 111 active priests in the diocese. The decline from 305 priests we had when I was ordained in 1970 is astounding and frightening. We simply cannot continue this way. Many of the men are burdened with two and three parishes and are burning themselves out. I can tell you what an effort it is to run two parishes just a few blocks apart; down in the diocese some of our men have 2 and 3 parishes, some of them 20 miles apart and they are constantly running back and forth between them. Interestingly, we are hearing from bishops around the world that it is time to openly discuss the requirement of mandatory celibacy for the clergy. The Brazilian bishops are discussing it as are the German bishops and the head of the Italian bishops conference said in a recent interview that we

need to have an open discussion about it "with no taboos attached."

That major change is taking place in the church can be evidenced again by the recent meeting of the Italian Bishops Conference in which a rather angry Pope Francis berated them and told them to begin to live a simple lifestyle, to stop all of the factions and jealousy among themselves and he told them that it is about Jesus Christ and not about them!!

I recently attended the annual meeting of the Erie County United Way, and I must tell you that no organization in this community is doing more to overcome poverty and illiteracy than the United Way. Over 8,300 Erie children are enrolled in the Dolly Parton Book Program whereby they get a free book every month until they are five years old. Programs are in place to help the poor with their income taxes, their prescriptions, job search, etc. This past year's successful campaign (the largest in United Way history) was chaired by St. Patrick parishioner Marlene Mosco, and the Executive Director of the United Way is another St. Patrick parishioner, Bill Jackson. I hope you will support United Way in its efforts. It is making a difference in Erie County. Poverty is the greatest challenge facing Erie as we continue to be one of the poorest areas in the entire commonwealth. United Way, the Erie Community Foundation and others are all working as has as they can to help people lift themselves out of poverty, and I hope you will support them in their efforts.

Volunteers are cleaning up and replanting the area around the shrine to the east of the church.
