



Today is the 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time and our first reading comes from the Old Testament book of the Prophet Ezekiel in which we hear God asserting his sovereignty in no uncertain terms. In the verses just preceding today's reading. Ezekiel delivers God's rebuff to Kind Zedekiah, who had angered God by breaking the covenant which God had formed with him. God eventually will restore Israel under a faithful king. In the closing lines, God, the author of life and sovereign lord of the universe says, "Watch what I will do; see the life I will generate; wait for the wonders I will work.".....Our second reading from Paul's second letter to the Corinthians is a passage in which Paul speaks of a confidence that defies logic, a confidence sustained by faith, not by sight. In worldly terms, this is nonsense. Only what can be seen and measured is real. All else is wishful thinking. But for Paul, faith provides as solid a foundation as concrete. It takes faith, he tells us, to walk through a life that feels like an exile from our true home. Our home, he tells us, is with the Lord; anything this side of heaven is far from ideal and often painful. Yet we endure this life and strive to please God for one day we will have to appear before the judgment seat of Christ where we will be judged according to how we lived "in the body.".....Our gospel from Mark is another coupling of two parables. Jesus taught his illiterate audience by using these stories, taking examples from the ordinary things of life. His audience could easily identify with his message. This first parable appears only in Mark's gospel; it is not found elsewhere. It makes the point that the harvest develops on its own, independent of the sower's efforts. So, too, the kingdom. Mysteriously, it develops quietly and often unnoticed, but with an irresistible power. Scholars feel that once Jesus had proclaimed this parable, many in his audience did not get it and so he reaches immediately for another parable, the familiar story of the mustard seed. Today's passage concludes with the comment from Mark that Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables, but did not explain any further; instead he gave those explanations to his disciples only.....This week is the traditional Emmaus retreat for the priests of the diocese. We will gather at St. Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe on Monday evening and the event will conclude on Thursday. Please keep your priests in prayer this week as we reflect, pray and relax together. We have been having an annual Emmaus gathering every June since Bishop Murphy became our bishop in 1982, making this our 30th year. Of course, when we began we had more than twice as many priests as we presently have.....We have a small group of women from St. Patrick's who have taken it upon themselves to call and then visit with shut-ins in the parish. They visit on a regular basis and bring a great deal of joy and happiness to these people, many of whom are very lonely. They rarely are able to get out of their homes and fewer and fewer of their peers and family visit them regularly. In many cases, children live out of town, so they welcome this group each month. In addition, I take communion to shut-ins on the First Friday of every month. It's my favorite day of the month. These people are so happy to see a friendly face......During the month of April, the Saint Patrick's Food Pantry distributed 23,918 pounds of food at a total cost to the parish of \$871. All of that food was given to 694 families, making our food pantry one of the largest in the entire city. When you stop and think of those figures, they are staggering, and it points to the high level of poverty in our midst, a poverty which disproportionately is carried by women and children...... hope you are as pleased with the new air conditioning system at St. Patrick's as I am. It is so guiet and in the years I've been here, the church has never been so comfortable in the hot summer months. The people who installed them emphasized very strongly with us how vital it is that the doors into the vestibule be kept closed and not propped open. We originally planned to have the units faux finished to match the marble, but once installed, we realized that is an unnecessary expense, and so we're going to leave them as they are. With the old air conditioning system that we had, it had to run for hours and hours before it began to make any noticeable change in the building. This system accomplishes everything in just an hour's time. The old system was a water based system and in the summer months our water bill was absolutely astronomical, and we don't have that anymore. The system is set to come on during the week if the temperature in the room goes over 80 degrees to keep humidity down......A special thanks to Tom Brunner who removed all of the brass plates on the inner vestibule doors and restored them. In the very near future, we'll start having those inner doors restored......When we do the restoration work at St. Patrick's, we are not going to restore the ground floor tower room in the southwest tower. The cost just to do that room would be in excess of \$35,000, and we decided to leave it as it is so that people can see the difference between what the building looked like before the restoration and what it looks like after......Have you returned your pledge card for our capital campaign so that we can begin work in mid-August. We are moving very well toward our goal, but we need everyone to participate by making a pledge. Please return your card as soon as possible so that our volunteers will not need to call on you personally.......A second grade teacher asked her class what kind of a little girl their mom was. One student answered, "My mom has always been my mom and none of that other stuff," while another child said, "I don't know because I wasn't there, but my guess would be pretty bossy." When asked what did their mom need to know about their dad before she married him, one student replied, "His last name," while another answered, "She had to know his background. Like is he a crook? Does he get drunk on beer?" And, finally, she asked her students, "Why did your mom marry your dad?" One little boy answered, "My dad makes the best spaghetti in the world, and my mom eats a lot." Another said, "She got too old to do anything else with him," while a third student responded, "My grandma says that mom didn't have her thinking cap on."
