#### From the Pastor's Desk.....

Today is the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time and we read from the Book of Job. In ancient Israel, there were three people who could speak with authority: the priest whose main duty was to instruct in the law; the prophet whose main duty was to convey God's word; and the sage whose function was to provide wise advice. The author of the Book of Job is unknown but would fall into the category of a sage. The Book of Job is the best known of the OT's "wisdom books." Long before Israel came into existence, Egypt, Mesopotamia and Phoenicia had produced wisdom literature. Israelite authors borrowed and adapted this but brought a unique element to the table: monotheism, belief in one God. Today's excerpt is near the end of the book when Job and his friends discuss why the innocent suffer. Prior to today's reading Job has expressed his outrage to God over suffering. Today God answers. The entire response from God can be summarized this way: the wise person finds meaning in suffering and trusts that the Lord governs the universe with purpose and fidelity.

When Paul wrote his Second Letter to the Corinthians in 55 AD, conditions had deteriorated from when he wrote the first letter a few months earlier. Paul had to defend himself against teachers who were telling the Corinthians not to listen to Paul who points to unity in Christ which can transcend their current divisions.

Mark alone gives us this account of Jesus calming the seas which he intends to show his divinity. As we heard in the first reading, God alone controls the sea. Then Jesus' question to them asking why they are afraid ("Do you not yet have faith?") reinforces one of the major themes of Mark's gospel: without faith, you are blind to Jesus' identity as Messiah and Son of God. By the time this scene plays out, the disciples have

witnessed many of Jesus' deeds, his teachings and his private lessons to them. That the disciples are still uncertain about Jesus' identity is intended by Mark to point the long process involved for many of us in coming to faith. Remember, in Mark, Jesus is endlessly frustrated by the lack of understanding and faith in his disciples.

We had an incident recently at St. Patrick's when a homeless man came into church and was lighting tapers and trying to set fire to the money box which is in the back of church for donations. Fortunately, we saw him on the security camera in the office and were able to get the police who caught him based on the security cameras. We're going to remove those money boxes. We simply don't need them.

As I mentioned recently, we received a check from our insurance company for \$43,000 toward the cost of replacing the boiler in St. Patrick's Church. Several people very generously gave gifts to help toward that cost and that money enables us to cover the deductible on the insurance as well as clean up other areas in the boiler room. There are more cut off and plugged pipes down there than you can imagine, and thanks to your generosity, the area is now first class.

As frightening as the explosion of the boiler was in February, we now end up with the church having a new air conditioning system, new heating system, all new wiring and new plumbing. There is always something good that comes out of the darkness.

The St. Patrick Food Pantry distributed 14,399 pounds of food during the month of May to a total of 656 families. The cost to the parish was \$1,546.92. Thanks to your ongoing generosity, we are able to provide this service to people who, in many ways, would not have adequate food. Of the people served in May, 401 were elderly and

901 were children.

We have to replace one of the freezers in the Food Pantry at a cost of approximately \$20,000. We have applied to the Erie Community Foundation for at least a partial grant toward the freezer. And thanks to your generosity, it appears that we will have enough in the Food Pantry account to cover the difference.

To date, 191 families in the parish have pledged \$93,000 toward the Catholic Services Appeal this year. This enables us to pay down \$47,000 on our restoration debt and pay the assessment to the diocese of \$46,000. That only leaves \$7,000 toward our goal of \$100,000. Almost 600 families in the parish have not responded. If you are one of them, would you consider a gift of any size?

A happy Father's Day to all of the fathers in both parishes. I will remember them at Mass today and will include any of your deceased fathers.

The Finance Councils of both parishes will meet this week to review and discuss the recommendations from the recent audit of the parishes by the diocese. When I came here six years ago I requested an audit of both parishes so that I could start of with a clean record. The parishes had been audited just two years earlier, but I still held my ground that I wanted an audit to mark the beginning of my term as pastor and that was done. There are finally a multitude of safeguards in place throughout the diocese for financial responsibility


