

From the Pastor's Desk.....

Today is the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary
Time and we hear first from Ezekiel, a priest who
was taken prisoner among the early deportations
leading up to the destruction of Judah. Judah became a vassal to Babylonia who began deporting
the people; but even in exile, the Chosen People
were given a prophet though they had refused to
listen to many of his predecessors. Ezekiel is
called to prophesy to a people who have long
ignored God's word, rebelled against his plan,
even attempted to kill prophets whose message
they did not want to hear. Ultimately, they will
come to recognize and listen to Ezekiel.

In a rather rare instance, today's second reading relates to both the first and the gospel. Like Ezekiel and Jesus, Paul must carry out the work he believes God has given him in the face of threats, resistance and difficulties. The precise nature of Paul's "thorn in the flesh" is unknown, but its purpose is clear: he must never congratulate himself but give thanks for God's grace. He begs God to remove his affliction only to be told that his experience of weakness can become the path to strength.

Today's gospel follows immediately from last Sunday's account of Jesus raising the synagogue official's daughter. Here the people continue to be astonished at him; he not only works wonders like a prophet, but he teaches in the synagogue. Usually only someone schooled in the Scriptures could speak in the synagogue but the people recognize Jesus' authority. The reference to Jesus as "son of Mary" is very unusual since Jewish custom referred to man as the son of his father. Some scholars suggest that Mark here expresses his belief that Jesus' true father is God. The peoples resistance to Jesus indicates lack of faith, and so Jesus cannot perform further mighty deeds among them. They are

confused how God could work through someone so ordinary. In many miracles, faith is a prerequisite; in others, it is the result of the miracle.

Do you ever get the feeling that God is calling you to a closer relationship, but you aren't sure how to go about getting there? Consider spiritual direction, an ancient practice in the church which is the help given by a qualified spiritual director which enables one to learn how to be aware of and pay attention to God's personal communication with us. Direction usually occurs once a month. St. Patrick's has a qualified spiritual director as a parishioner. Ron Mangine has over 35 years of experience and has completed a graduate study certification program in Christian Spiritual Guidance. He also teaches methods of contemplative prayer. He has also taught RCIA and facilitated the Why Catholic program for over 15 years. If you have an interest in learning more about spiritual direction and how it might help you develop a closer relationship with God, Ron can be reached weeknight evenings at 474-3555. At this time, there are only five openings.

Saint Patrick's Finance Council met last week to review the recommendations from the recent audit done by the diocese. A small change we will be making is that envelopes will be mailed on a bimonthly basis rather than monthly, resulting in a small savings. The audit also called for the Finance Council to review the finances of the Food Pantry as well as the gift shop. Both of those are under review at the present time. In a new policy for the diocese, only the pastor of the parish and the Dean of that area (in our case, Father John Malthaner, pastor of St. Luke's) have their signatures on the parish checking account. In the past, a second person either on the parish staff or a lay person had their name of the account; and Bishop Persico has altered that policy.

The most reaching recommendation is that we

undertake a census of the parish. We are getting ready to do that after the first of the year. We will print out the census information we have on each family and mail it to you so that you can make any changes and then return it to us. Our parish population has grown significantly to where we are now at more than 750 families. Otherwise, the finances at St. Patrick's are very solid.

The Finance Council of St. Hedwig's Parish also met last week to review the recommendations from their audit. Unfortunately, the finances there are not in a very good position. As a matter of fact, we will probably close the fiscal year with a deficit for this year of about \$15,000. Membership also continues to decline as older parishioners die or move into some form of assisted living and are not longer able to attend Mass at the parish and consequently unable to support the parish. The recommendations from the diocese call for the checking account of the Holy Name Society and the Rosary Society to be under the direction of the parish office with only the pastor's name being on the checking accounts of both of those organizations.

A further recommendation from the diocese is that since there is so little bookkeeping, etc. at St. Hedwig's, that this work be transferred and done in the office at St. Patrick's. The Finance Committee voted not to undertake this move at this time, but to continue doing things the way we have. There is also a recommendation that there be a census of the parish, and, once again, we will undertake that after the first of the year. Parish membership is presently at less than 100 families and there have been no baptisms in the last eight years, two weddings and a large number of funerals, more in fact than at St. Patrick's.

During a visit to my doctor, I asked him, "How do you determine whether or not an older person should be put in an old age home?" "Well," he replied, "we fill up a bathtub, then we offer a teaspoon, a teacup and a bucket and ask the person to empty the bathtub." "Oh, I understand," I said, "A normal person would use the bucket because it is bigger than the spoon or the teacup." "No," he replied. "A normal person would pull the plug. Do you want a bed near a window?"
