

Today is the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time and our first reading is from the final chapter of Isaiah, authored by someone known as Third Isaiah. In this chapter, the Israelites have returned to their homeland after exile in Babylon and the author is

presenting visions for their future life with the Lord. This beautiful poem seems out of place in the chapter as it comes immediately following Third Isaiah's rant against worship that emphasizes worldly, sacrificial offerings which do not draw people to an internal conversion of the heart. The author portrays Jerusalem as a mother giving birth to her children. Joy will be so prevalent when Jerusalem gives birth to the new people of God that she will not experience any labor. The entire theme of this reading is rejoice because God will comfort the people of Jerusalem as a mother comforts her children.

Our second reading is from Paul's Letter to the Galatians, the fifth and final Sunday in a row in which we have heard this letter read. Today's excerpt is the ending, Paul's final words to them. He emphasizes again that salvation comes via the cross, not through any sacrificial offerings or keeping the law. In contrast to the warm words Paul leaves at the end of all his other letters, today he extols them not to cause him any more trouble. Despite the tenuous relationship he has with the Galatians, he still calls them brothers and sisters.

Today's gospel is Luke's reflection on mission as he sends seventy-two others and having already sent the twelve. Luke is emphasizing that Jesus' mission extends to all who follow him, whether Jew or Gentile. The final section notes the return of the disciples who are rejoicing at the success of their mission.

Bishop Donald Trautman will be teaching a course in Biblical Studies during the fall 2013 semester in the Graduate Studies program at Gannon University. The bishop is a recognized scripture scholar having studied biblical languages at Catholic University of America. having earned his licentiate in Sacred Scripture from the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome and his doctorate in Sacred Theology from the Pontifical University of St. Thomas in 6 - 8:50 PM from September 9 through December 16. Saint Patrick Food Pantry distributed 23,988 pounds of food during the month of May to a total of 712 families. The cost to the parish was \$602.79. I continue to marvel at the excellent work that these volunteers do, and we're always looking for additional volunteers. It only requires time on Tuesday morning from 8:30 until noon. If interested in volunteering, please call the parish office.

I think I mentioned earlier that we have completed a great deal of work in the Food Pantry. Thanks to the Erie Community Foundation for a grant, we were able to install an entire new floor which was badly needed. We also installed new doors for the entry and a new restroom. That entire area had been let go and was desperately in need of upgrading.

In addition to the Food Pantry, the Knights and Ladies of Saint Patrick cook and serve a hot breakfast to the clients several times a year. We set up a tent in the east parking lot with tables, etc. and they serve scrambled eggs, sausage, rolls, etc.

Bishop Persico had a consultant speak to all of the priests of the diocese about the process for the reconfiguration of parishes. This priest, from the Diocese of Greensburg, led the process in that diocese, and we are going to follow their procedures. The bishop noted that in addition to the reconfiguration of parishes, we need to undertake a rather extensive faith formation process to better explain our Catholic faith to ourselves and in particular to our children. Some of our faith

formation, particularly with our children, has been less than sufficient for them to understand and then be able to embrace the faith. The bishop is now meeting with the 3 regional vicars and the deans to begin the process of reconfiguration of parishes. He will then appoint a committee composed of clergy, religious and lay people to help direct the process.

One of the problems he will face in the diocese is that we have some very small parishes down in some of the rural areas, but there is no other parish in close proximity. In those cases, even though the parish might be very small, it will have to remain open to serve the people who otherwise would be isolated. The opposite is true here in the city, particularly on the lower east side where we have a multiplication of parishes in very close proximity to one another. In that area in particular, it will be easy for people to attend a nearby church. Though it will be painful to see some of our churches be closed, we have no other option. There are very few people attending and we simply don't have the priests to staff them. I will admit to you, that at 70. I'm tired with running back and forth between two parishes even though they are only 4 blocks apart.. In some of the rural areas of the diocese, priests have 2 and 3 parishes, some of which are ten and twenty miles from one another. The guys are running ragged trying to maintain that schedule.

















