

From the Pastor's Desk.....

Today is the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time and we hear first from the prophet Amos. The conversation is between Amaziah, a priest of Bethel in the northern kingdom (Israel) and the prophet Amos who was a prophet of the southern kingdom (Judah). Amos is very critical of people who observe external rituals but tolerated social injustice. Amaziah has had enough of Amos's criticism and orders him to leave Israel and return to his own land. Amos doesn't mince any words, reminding Amaziah that he speaks for God and will continue to criticize their idolatry.

Though addressed to the community at Ephesus, Paul's letter is addressed to all Christians. Many biblical scholars actually date this letter as coming after the death of Paul, but it does continue Pauline theology. Some think it was a type of a circular letter intended to be read to all of the different faith communities. The author inserts what is often called the hymn of the church. Its poetic language apparently draws upon liturgy and prayers already in use by the early Christians. The letter stresses the centrality of Jesus in God's plan and in the unity of the church. Though not mentioned in this section, the letter will eventually emphasize the unity of Jews and Gentiles in one newly created people.

Today's gospel follows immediately on last Sunday's in which Jesus expressed regret at the people's lack of faith. After visiting villages, Jesus turns to the twelve, a representative group comparable to the patriarchs of the twelve tribes of Israel. With those he commissions, Jesus shares authority over unclean spirits, but cautions them to support one another, undertaking their work in pairs. Echoing what we heard last Sunday, Jesus instructs the twelve not to linger in places that refuse to listen. translates an Old Testament word, often used by the prophets, that mean "to turn." It involves a complete about-face in perceiving, judging and acting. In Mark, Jesus's first words proclaim the nearness of the kingdom of God and are followed immediately by a call to repent.

We are now at \$95,000 in pledges for the 2015 Catholic Services Appeal toward our goal of \$100,000. Of the amount pledged, \$67,000 has already been paid. Thank you for your generosity.

Mark your calendar! Erie Gives Day is Tuesday, August 11th. Last year, St. Patrick's Parish received over \$27,000 in donations on that day, an amount which is then added to because of a generous gift from the Erie Community Foundation and General Electric.

As soon as we get all of the financial statements for the 2014/15 fiscal year gathered together, I'll publish a financial statement on both parishes so that you have a better understanding of where we are.

At a recent St. Patrick's Parish Council meeting, it was recommended that we have the Lenten Scripture classes also available in the evenings so that people who are working can attend. I told them that this year we will offer them on a Thursday morning at 10 AM and again that evening at 7 PM.

Council also wrestled with the suggestion to have teenagers be ministers at one Mass a month, ie., Eucharistic Ministers, lectors, ushers, etc. Discussion centered on the fact that we don't have that many people that age in the parish. We have a significant number of college age students and a huge number of children under the age of 4 or 5; but that the present number of teenagers would not be enough to undertake such a step. They recommended that Fr. Kriegel continue to seek

young people to serve as lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, etc.

Let me take a couple of bulletins and share with you some information all of we priests received recently from the Marriage Tribunal of the diocese. They explained the grounds for an annulment and let me share that with you over a period of several weeks.

Insufficient Use of Reason. To enter a valid marriage, a person must have the degree of reasoning ability sufficient to know and understand what marriage is and what he or she is doing at the time of the marriage. Serious conditions such as certain personality disorders profound mental retardation or black-out states (caused by alcoholic intoxication, drug use or seizure disorder), might prevent a person from using adequate reasoning ability at the time of the marriage.

Grave lack of Discretion of Judgment. To enter a valid marriage, a person must have use of sound and mature judgment. This means that the person is making a prudent and free decision, after careful consideration, to enter marriage with a particular person, and that the decision is not impulsive or without forethought.

Incapacity to Assume the Essential Obligations of *marriage*. To enter a valid marriage, a person must have the psychological ability to take on and to live out the lifetime obligations of marriage. Persons cannot consent to something that is beyond their psychological capacity to fulfill.

Ignorance of the Nature of Marriage. To enter a valid marriage, a person must have basic knowledge of what marriage is about. A necessary element of that knowledge is to know that marriage by its nature involves openness to children.


