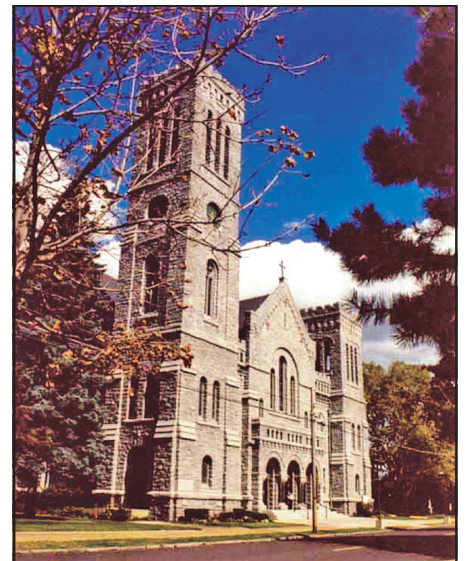
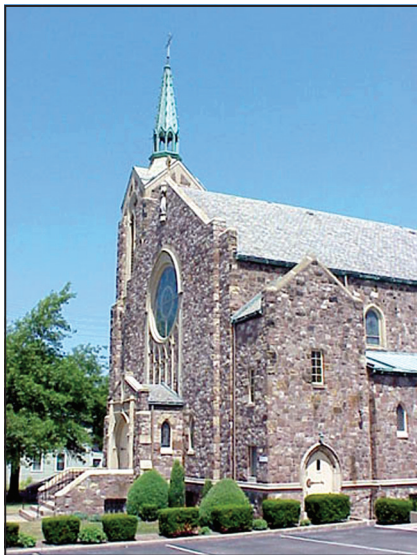

Today is the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time and our first reading is from Amos who preached in the northern kingdom during prosperous times, but where the needy were neglected, worship was little more than posturing and immorality was common. God called Amos from his life as a shepherd to warn Israel to reform and he rails against the false spirituality at Bethel. His fiery oratory made him very unpopular especially among the powerful elite. He concludes by telling them he left the fields where he was a shepherd reluctantly only because God had called him.....In Paul's Letter to the Ephesians we get a classic example of how scripture rarely tells us what to do but, instead, who we are. Today we are told that we are chosen, made for holiness and a single possession of God. In the final paragraph we hear an expanded vision of Church which has grown from a local to a global community.....Finally, from Mark we hear today Jesus giving his disciples their marching orders. Mark's account permits the use of a walking stick and sandals, something not found in Matthew or Luke, but all else must come from the bounty of God. What Jesus ultimately gives them is authority. He tells them to be ready to act at a moment's notice, not weighed down or distracted by what we think are essentials. And, finally, we should note that Jesus sends the 12 apostles, not the 72 disciples, making his tone intimate and solicitous with these privileged friends. The St. Patrick Parish Picnic is Sunday, July 29 at Shades Beach. We hope you can join us.... Please also mark your calendar for the Erie Irish Festival September 14, 15 & 16. I'm not only hoping you can attend but that you might help volunteer to assist the project.....And, finally, mark your calendar for Saturday, October 20, for our 175th Anniversary banquet at the Erie Bayfront Convention Center.....The final plans for the restoration of St. Patrick's Church are falling in place, and we're ready to get started in early August. We now have bids for the carpet, the new sanctuary floor, the pews, the lighting and the painting. I must confess I'm stunned at how very expensive all of these items are, but at the same time, we don't want to go cheap and then have it start to unravel in a few years. It's better to do it right.....I think you'll be amazed at the new lighting in the church and how much it will highlight the architecture and art of the building. The bulbs in the new lighting fixtures are guaranteed to last at least 10 years and most likely 15 years! I'll probably be dead by then so I don't have to worry about changing them!!!.....Today's bulletin contains an insert with the timetable for the restoration of St. Patrick's Church. As you can readily see, it's a tight schedule and is dependent upon everyone meeting their end of the bargain. The Conrad Schmitt people from Milwaukee, the artists who will do the restoration, have met with all of the other vendors and assure us that this timetable is workable.....The Cauley is practically set up for our weekend Masses. The only thing left to do is take the altar, ambo, organ, etc. from the weekday chapel over. Grise has designed a temporary sound system for us, so we should be all set. It's not going to be the most comfortable nor prayerful environment, but it will make us appreciate coming back into church. It's going to be quite the Christmas here at St. Patrick's this year as we come back into the church for the first time on Christmas Eve.....Weekday Masses during the renovation will be held in the chapel in St. Patrick's rectory. People coming to Mass can park behind the rectory, the back door will be open and you can just come in. You can either go up the stairs in the back hallway to the second floor chapel or you can come into the main front hallway and take the elevator up..... Invitations for the St. Patrick's 175th Banquet on October 20 will be going in the mail at the end of August. If anyone who is not a registered parishioner would like an invitation, please call the parish office and we will be happy to send you one. We'd love to have you join us for the celebration. An outline of that event is included also in today's bulletin.....I'm looking for a volunteer to come into the rectory a few hours a week during the month of September to record all of the return envelopes when they come in. There are various choices for the meal, and we need to make sure we get all of that done correctly. Please contact the parish office.....When guests arrive the night of the banquet, there will be a registration table with place cards in alphabetical order. Your place card will be coded as to your choice of a meal. People can take their place card and then take it to any table you want. Perhaps people want to sit together and so they can put their cards at a particular table.....While there will be a cash bar that night until the time the entertainment begins after dinner, there will also be a complimentary bottle of red wine and white wine on each table.....**Have you made your pledge to the St. Patrick's Restoration Fund yet? Less than half of the parishioners have responded so far, and we need your participation - to whatever degree you feel you can contribute. Please join in helping to bring this dream to fruition.....**The St. Patrick Food Pantry distributed 28,165 pounds of food during the month of May at a cost of \$1,735.50 to the parish. A total of 827 families were given food.....Coffee and donuts are served on the rectory lawn after the 10:30 Mass today. The chairs of our Volunteer Committee for the festival, Ann Halupczynski and Marilyn Lechner, will be at a table hoping you will sign up to help. Our success depends on you.....A first grade teacher asked her students, "What's the difference between moms and dads?" One student replied, "Mom's work at work and work at home and dads just go to work at work," while another replied, "Mom's know how to talk to teachers without scaring them." And, finally, one student replied, "Dads are taller and stronger, but moms have all the real power 'cause that's who you got to ask if you want to sleep over at your friend's.".....On the church sign of the First Church of Awesome Works, "How do we make Holy Water? We boil the hell out of it."....A second grade teacher asked a student, "Glenn, how do you spell 'crocodile?'" Glenn replied, "K-R-O-K-O-D-I-L-E," to which the teacher said, "No, that's wrong." Glenn responded, "Maybe it's wrong, but you asked me how I spell it!"
