






Today is the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time and we hear first from the first Book of Kings. It would be remarkable in our day for one to choose "wisdom" over riches and power. But Solomon is presented as making that choice in this seminal scene that lays

the foundation for the wisdom he later demonstrates in multiple arenas of life. That Solomon would make this choice suggests the ultimate value of wisdom; no other value ranks above it. He is a young man overwhelmed by his responsibilities, and keenly aware of his deficiencies. Yet he desires nothing more than to serve well. He is sincere and unassuming in his deprecating assessment of himself and in his request for "an understanding heart."

In times of trial, on the darkest days, few words of Scripture offer comfort and healing like these word's of Paul's in his letter to the Romans. His message is meaningful only to ears of faith and those who have taken the long view and seen pain, sorrow, disappointment and disillusion gradually yield new life and grace. His words are taken from a longer discourse in which he discusses the challenges of life and the pain that so often invades it. The second and third sentences assure, like a kind grandparent, not prove like a courtroom lawyer, that with God nothing is useless and nothing happens in vain.

In Jesus' stories, the Kingdom is a seeker, looking for and finding US rather than the other way around. The "treasure" seems to reach up through the ground to grab the man's attention. God's initiative, repeated in each story, is nonexclusive; all are given equal opportunity to possess a treasure beyond price. But there is a role for the seeker. Having encountered a valuable treasure, one must employ all available means to secure it, even to the point of hiding the treasure from its rightful owners in order to purchase it without their knowledge. Jesus is not endorsing spurious tactics. But, as in other parables, he creates a character who employs questionable behavior to make his point that acquiring the Kingdom of God is worth resorting to whatever means are necessary. Each parable issues a call and stresses the rewards of sacrificing everything for God's reign. The dragnet story reminds us of the kingdom's all-embracing reach. The net collects things of every kind, not just what is

good and worthy. Good and evil coexist in the Kingdom; only at the end will evil be excluded. Judgment rings through these lines, though not without a sense of loss. The message is that to be counted among the righteous, as with the acquisition of the treasures, no sacrifice will be too great.

We've encountered a major structural problem in the basement of St. Hedwig's Church. The recent heavy rainfalls that we have had resulted in an enormous amount of water coming into the basement. In addition, it has caused the back wall to buckle. We have had two engineers look at it and they have told us that unless it is repaired, the entire wall could collapse. Bishop Persico had told me earlier that we are not to put any more money into the buildings at St. Hedwig's until we know what the future configuration of the diocese is going to be. However, we have been given permission to correct this problem. We are now getting bids on the work and will get at it as soon as possible.

At St. Patrick's rectory, we have had a terrible time trying to keep the carpet in the entrance hall clean. That carpet was only laid down 4 years ago and it has not been a good investment. We recently took up all of that carpet and have restored the beautiful oak hardwood floors that are under it. Those of you who saw my apartment on the third floor of the rectory saw the beautiful hardwood floors that we restored up there. The main entrance hall now looks the same.

A printed program for the Irish Festival is being prepared. At most other festivals, people take out an ad in memory of deceased parents, spouse, grandparents or an entire family who may have belonged to the parish in the past. Those ads are still available and information can be obtained at the parish office.

We're still in need of a lot more volunteers for the Irish Festival. We particularly need people who will take a one hour time slot to be in the church sometime between 5-8 PM on Friday and 5:30-8 PM on Saturday. We are going to have the church open during those times; and we need to have someone in there to keep an eye on the visitors as well as to answer any questions they might have. We are also in need of additional

volunteers for the Irish Breakfast on Sunday morning from 8:30—noon. Sometime during the week before the festival we have to set up the tables and chairs at the Church of the Nativity Social Center and then sometime during the week after the festival, we need to take them down and store them. We will also be in need of volunteers to tear down the festival on Monday and Tuesday of the week following the event.

We have a group of 70 people—mostly St. Patrick parishioners—who are doing a 10 day trip to Italy in May 2015. I have been able to secure permission to celebrate Mass for the group at the tomb of St. Peter, way beneath the high altar of the Basilica of St. Peter. Ironically, that trip was completely filled within 24 hours! September 1-12, 2015 we are doing a trip of 2 nights in Athens and then a 7 night cruise of the Greek Isles. That trip will also spend a day in Istanbul and a day at Ephesus. At Ephesus, we will tour the ruins — some of the most incredible ruins you will see in your life—and then we will also go up to Mary's House—in the mountains above Ephesus where most scholars believe she lived & died.

There will be a meeting Tuesday morning (July 29) at 10 AM in the weekday chapel for anyone who is interested in participating in our program to help single mothers in the inner city.

There I was sitting at the bar staring at my drink when a large, trouble-making biker sits down next to me, grabs my drink and gulps it down. "Whatcha' gonna do about it?" he asked as I burst into tears. "Come on, man," said the biker, "I didn't think you'd cry. I can't stand to see a man crying." "This the worst day of my life," I responded. "I'm a complete failure. I was late for a meeting and my boss fired me. When I went to the parking lot, I discovered that my car had been stolen, and I don't have any insurance. I left my wallet in the cab I took home and then I found my wife with another man. And to top it all off, the dog bit me. So I came to this bar to work up the courage to put an end to all of it. I bought a drink, dropped a capsule of poison in and sit here watching the poison dissolve, and then you show up and drink the whole thing. But, hell, enough about me. How are you doing?"
