



From the Pastor's Desk Today is the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time and again we read first from Genesis, a section which follows last Sunday's reading where Abraham provided hospitality to three men. It is during their visit that Abraham hears God's promise to Sarah that she will

bear a son. In the verses between the two readings, the men continue to Sodom and Gomorrah and God tells Abraham of the sin in those places. Isaiah says the sin is not caring for neighbors; Ezekiel says it is not feeding the poor and Jeremiah says it is adultery. Abraham begins by asking God about his stance toward the innocent and doesn't give him a chance to answer, but continues with the first of six questions, intended to test the Lord's patience and mercy. Finally, Abraham gets the answer he is looking for, that God will spare ten innocent people. The Lord's mercy is available to all.

Our brief second reading from Colossians is the culmination of the author's argument about the sovereignty of Christ and his reign over creation. The author notes that they have been reborn in baptism and recalls that when they were mired in sin before baptism, God still brought them to life in Christ. He notes that Christ cancelled all debts that we owe through his death.

Today's gospel begins again with Jesus going off to pray. Remember in Luke, Jesus always go into prayer after a public act. Today's section follows the story of Martha and Mary. The disciples ask Jesus to teach them how to pray. Luke's Our Father has five petitions. "Your kingdom come" encourages the disciples to herald its coming by their daily actions. "Daily bread" refers to both physical and spiritual sustenance for all. "Forgive our sins" is again in the plural as it refers to all. It notes that we have to forgive everyone. And the final petition asks that God spare them the final trial. Following the prayer, Jesus tells a simple story of persistence, just as Abraham was persistent in the first reading.

The Kenedy Directory is the official Catholic directory for the United States. It lists every parish, priest, women religious, diocesan officials, etc. The 2013 has arrived and it contains the results of a study on the status of Catholicism in America. It reveals that in 1965 there were 1,088,463 baptisms and by 2010 that number had fallen to 793,103. That is a staggering decline. The number of marriages was 426,309 in 1965 and that has fallen to 163,775. That is even more frightening. The number of funerals was 417,779 in 1965 and today is 412,145. In 1965, Catholic marriages totaled 20% of all marriages in the country. Today they total 8%!

The data shows that 87% of Catholic births result in a baptism; 71% of Catholic deaths result in a funeral but only 34% of marriages involving a Catholic spouse are in a Catholic church.

The study also shows that 106 million people say they were Catholic at some point in their life; 73 million say they now identify as Catholic. Of that number, 51 million say they attend Mass on Christmas and Easter,37 million say they attend Mass once a month and only 18 million say they attend Mass weekly.

There will be NO Saturday 4:30 PM Mass at St. Hedwig's next Saturday, August 3rd. Father Santor is out of town and I simply cannot find a priest. There is a 5 PM Mass at St. Patrick's.

I am honored to have been asked to serve on the Board of Directors of the Erie County Historical Society, a board which is rather dominated by St. Patrick parishioners. Chairperson is Jack Watts, and also serving on the board are Dick Wachter, Matt Lechner and Becky Johnson, all of whom are parishioners. In addition, the Executive Director is another parishioner, Cal Pifer.

Kudos to UPMC Hamot for its gift of \$750,000 to BEST, the Bayfront Eastside Task Force, to be used in our ongoing effort to restore this neighborhood. In the past five years, BEST has demolished 42 squalid homes, built 22 new ones and restored a number of apartments in the area. I'm a member of that Board of Directors, and we have a dynamic Executive Director in the person of St. Luke parishioner Jeremy Bloeser. Thanks to this gift from Hamot we can continue joining efforts with them and Erie Insurance to revitalize this neighborhood. Our goal now is to get young professional people living in the area.

Archbishop Charles Chaput of Philadelphia announced recently that the archdiocese had an operating deficit of \$39 million for fiscal year

2012. That's grown from \$12 million the year before. That deficit occurred despite the sale of the Archbishop's Residence for \$60 million and the sale of a New Jersey beachfront mansion used by archdiocesan clergy for \$12 million. It is estimated that the deficit for next year will be \$5 million. The report focused solely on archdiocesan operations and did not include parishes or schools who operated to large degree in the red. Much of that deficit is caused by the fact that parishes are so financially strapped that they cannot pay their assessments to the diocese. That same reality is occurring in our diocese and it is one of the factors which will be used to determine the future reconfiguration of parishes. If parishes cannot pay their bills, they simply cannot stay open. In addition, many of these parishes have century old buildings which require constant upkeep and maintenance and much of that is not being done because there is no money.

When I arrived here, I was rather shocked to discover that St. Patrick's Church is only insured for \$1 million. We have since raised that insurance to \$16 million and an additional \$4.6 million insurance on the Stations of the Cross. The Conrad Schmitt artists from Milwaukee, who did our restoration, told me that to replicate this building today would cost between \$44 and \$46 million!!! That is staggering when you think of it. We are in the process of cutting a door through the wall between the southwest tower room and the restroom so brides will have access to a restroom, and we discovered that the walls are 4 feet, 2 inches thick!!! They are solid brick.
