



Today is the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time and we hear our first reading from the Book of Wisdom. It attests to the steady, covenant faith of the Israelites, a faith in God's love that prepared them to endure hardship. The author of Wisdom also meditates on

the strange dynamic in which Israel was strengthened by the same events that caused her enemies suffering. The author cites five examples, known as diptychs, because one act provides the hinge or connection from which both the blessing of the Israelites and the punishment of the Egyptians takes place. Those examples include water coming from the rock contrasted with the first plague of the Nile's water turning into blood; God providing quail to nourish his people instead of the plagues of front, gnats and flies; nature raining manna instead of hail, thunder and lightning that punish and finally the saving of Israel's sons during the Passover when the tenth plague put the death the Egyptian sons.

Our second reading comes from Hebrews, and we will read from this letter for the next four Sundays. Its author is unknown, but probably had some connection to Paul, and it dates from very late in the first century. Hebrews has two main themes: the high priesthood of Jesus and the journey of God's people to their heavenly home. Today's passage describes how Abraham embodies faith, using four repetitions of the phrase "By faith" to emphasize that God calls the Hebrews and us today to live in faith, following Abraham's example. The author sees God's gift of returning Abraham's son as a prefiguring of God raising Jesus from the dead. At the bottom line, the reading is telling us that we should be all the more hopeful because we have both the faith of Abraham and the knowledge of Jesus' resurrection to sustain us.

Between the conclusion of last Sunday's gospel and the beginning of today's, Jesus elaborates on the theme of dependence on God. He advises the disciples not to worry about their physical needs, but rather to seek the Kingdom of God. In today's excerpt Jesus gives the disciples three instructions: sell everything, give alms and provide themselves with lasting money bags. Peter, so typically clueless, wants to know if this applies to all or just to church leaders. Jesus responds with a question which he immediately answers.

Jesus also responds by saying that the faithful steward is the one already doing the service that needs to be done.

If you are making a monthly payment on your pledge to the Restoration, you might want to wait until Tuesday, August 13th to make your payment. That is Erie Gives Day and we will have the opportunity to share in an additional \$200,000 that has been donated to be prorated among all participants.

Things are gearing up fast for the Irish Festival on September 14 & 15. On Sunday, Sept. 16, we will be serving a full Irish breakfast at Rainbow Gardens from 8:30 AM until 12:30 PM. We're always in need of additional volunteers. Please contact the parish office if you can help. This is our largest fundraiser of the year and the proceeds will go toward paying off the debt on the restoration of St. Patrick's Church. We hope you'll join us for some of the festivities.

I am moving from St. Hedwig's rectory over to St. Patrick's rectory. The only problem at St. Patrick's is that there is no privacy on the first floor. We use the dining room, living room and kitchen every day, and so it would be very uncomfortable to try to live in those rooms. I am taking the entire third floor of the rectory and putting in an apartment where I will have some privacy. There is an elevator which makes access very easy. I'm putting in a small compact kitchen, dining room, bedroom, bath, living room and a study. The building is under utilized on the second and third floors, and this seems a good way to use it as well as a way to have some privacy. I hope to move in by the middle of October. Right now we are installing central air, we're going to pull all of the old carpeting out as there are beautiful oak hardwood floors underneath. Walls need painted and then I should be ready to move.

Payments on pledges to the restoration of the church continue to come in at a very good pace. We had pledges of \$1,1013,584 and to date we have payments of \$713,784. We are repaying the diocese at the rate of \$10,000 + interest each month and presently owe about \$600,000. The balance of payments will all go toward that as will the profits from the Irish Festival. I estimate we should be debt free in five years.

From the Pastor's Desk continued......

Unfortunately, we have to do some additional work on the roof of St. Patrick's Church. I hadn't planned on this, but we certainly don't want water or dampness getting inside the building after the beautiful restoration. We're about half way done with the work which is going to cost over \$70,000. I wish it wasn't so, but that's the cost of old buildings.

The roof on the rectory at St. Hedwig's is in very bad condition and there is a lot of water damage inside the house because of that. There is also a problem with some water damage in the church. You can see if it you look up at the ceiling just before entering the sacristy where water is coming in. The windows in both the church and the rectory are in terrible condition. Some of the stained glass is badly warped and the windows in the house are in terrible condition. Unfortunately there is no money to be able to repair and replace these windows and roofs. My biggest worry at St. Hedwig's is the boiler. Every year when we turn it on, we spend \$3 or \$4,000 putting more band aids on it. I'm afraid one of these years it's simply not going to come on, and then we're in serious trouble.

Have you ever thought of including your parish in your estate planning. You can leave a gift for a particular purpose or for general use. At St. Patrick's, we have established the St. Patrick Foundation whose money can only be used for the maintenance and upkeep of the church. With buildings as old as that church is, upkeep will be an every day affair. You can also name your parish as beneficiary in an insurance policy. Any size gift would make a huge difference.

Some thoughts to get you through the day. "Good health is merely the slowest possible rate at which one can die." "Give a person a fish and you feed him for a day. Teach a person to use the Internet and they won't bother you for weeks, months, maybe even years." "Health nuts are going to feel really stupid someday lying in hospitals dying of nothing." "All of us could take a lesson from the weather. It pays no attention to criticism." "In the 60s, people took acid to make the world weird. Now the world is weird, and people take Prozac to make it normal."
