



Today is the 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time and our first reading comes from the Book of Proverbs. In the verses that follow today's reading, we meet Folly. Wisdom's opposite who also invites people to feast on sweet and pleasing fare, but here is unhealthy. It is born of selfish desire and leads to death. Wisdom, on the other hand, does not offer the shortcuts of deceit and self-indulgence that Folly serves, but instead virtue and divine truth. There are two important thoughts here: first is God's initiative in calling us to dine on nutritious food that sustains us. Second, our freedom to choose is a great responsibility that ultimately determines whether we live or die.....Our second reading continues again from Paul's letter to the Ephesians in which Paul follows the theme of our first reading and warns us against the dangers of being foolish. He notes that ignorance and debauchery are the food of fools......Our gospel again this week comes from chapter 6 of John and is a highly developed theological treatise in which the author is reflecting back on what Christ taught and writes it almost as if writing a homily. Everything that Jesus says about Eucharist defies reason. "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" asks the crowd. While the crowd is skeptical and full of scorn, Jesus stands his ground that he is the true food and says that only those who feast at his table will be raised up on the last day. Just as Jesus derives life from his Father, so the believer derives life from feeding on the bread of life. And the bread, unlike the manna of the past, will not simply sustain them for a day or a season, but for all time......Mark your calendars for September 14, 15 & 16 for the Irish Festival and call the parish office if you are able to serve as a volunteer......Also mark your calendar for Saturday, October 20, for our 175th Anniversary Banquet at the Bayfront Convention Center. It promises to be a fun evening. Invitations will be mailed in early September......Please join me in keeping Bishop-elect Lawrence Persico in your prayers. It must be a daunting and rather frightening time in his life as he leaves the security of a diocese where he has served for over 25 years to undertake the leadership of a neighboring diocese. The Greensburg priests tell we Erie priests that there will be many tears shed when he leaves because he is very well liked and well respected by everyone. From all reports, we are very fortunate to have him as our new bishop. At the age of 61, he could be our bishop for the next 14 years. One of the things that priests praise him for in Greensburg is the way he led the diocese through downsizing to consolidate parishes, etc. because of the shortage of both people in the pews and priests to serve them. He's certainly going to face a similar challenge in our diocese.......We're continuing to use St. Patrick's Church for weddings and funerals until August 25th when we have the last wedding here. Though the pews in the side aisles have been removed and scaffolding is being erected, the center pews and the sanctuary will remain in place until August 25. From then until Christmas, we'll have funerals at St. Hedwig's and our weddings are being held at the cathedral......St. Patrick parishioner Barb Fisher will take video inside the church on a regular basis and post it on our web page so that you can see what is happening. We're also fortunate that professional photographer John Baker is donating his time and effort to take before and after photographs of the church interior as well as ongoing photographs of the restoration work so that it will all be recorded for future generations......Pledges continue to come in for the St. Patrick restoration and I encourage you if you have not done so, to consider making one. We will certainly go over budget particularly with having to replace all of the wiring in the attic. (However, with this we will now have new wiring everywhere in the church). At the present time, with a goal of \$1 million, we have pledges of \$1,021,000 and growing!!.....In addition to the work that is going on in the church, we've had to undertake some needed repairs to the rectory. The front steps and the side bars had to be completely rebuilt as they were literally falling apart. In addition, if you look closely at the building you will notice that a good deal of the mortar is missing between the bricks. We're starting to correct that and are doing it in sections. We have now done the front and west side up to the top of the ground floor windows, and as I have the funds, we'll continue. We also have to do some major upgrades on the electrical system in the rectory. We are constantly blowing circuits simply because the system is outdated and inadequate for today's needs. I guess it's simply the fact that we're dealing with an old building and we need to be constantly vigilant with it. There were a lot of years of neglect and that's now caught up with us, and we'll get it. It just might take a bit longer.....We're also starting to pay the bills for the restoration work and the money is going fast!!! As expected!! We started with approximately \$400,000 in cash against pledges of \$1 million. We had to make a payment of \$75,000 to the Conrad Schmitt Studio, a payment of \$20,000 to the people restoring the pews, \$40,000 to the electrical consultant, \$25,000 to the scaffolding company, and on and on. We knew it would be this way and we have an open line of credit

From the Pastor's Desk continued......with the diocese to borrow money as we need it and then repay as pledge payments come in. I did the exact same thing twice before when we undertook construction of a Parish Center at St. Jude's as well as a later addition to OLCS.....The Eastside Catholic Faith Formation Ministry serves as the religious education program for all of the eastside parishes. They are presently in need of additional teachers for children in grades 1 through 11. If interested please contact Sister Marie at the St. Patrick's Office.....Jeff Rouse, the artist who restored our Stations of the Cross and who many of you know, called the other day to say that he is heartbroken that his pastor is leaving—our new Bishop Persico. Jeff said he goes to Mass every morning and then the bishop-elect invites everyone into the rectory for a cup of coffee before he goes to his office at the chancery. He has been their pastor for 14 years, and Jeff said we are going to get great enjoyment out of his sense of humor. Jeff reiterated something that the bishop-elect himself said and that is that he hates to travel. I feel sorry for him coming to this diocese, but he can curtail some of that by delegating various responsibilities......A few more paraprosdokians: "I didn't say it was your fault; I said I was blaming you." "A clear conscience is the sign of a fuzzy memory." "You do not need a parachute to skydive.
