





Today is the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time and we hear first from the concluding chapter of Isaiah. Most scholars feel that three authors wrote 3 different parts of the book. Chapters 56-66 are the work of the third author and are called Third Isaiah. He wrote

during the period when the people had returned home from the Babylonian Exile, and he struggled with people who had a narrow vision of who belonged to God's people. Today we hear him proclaiming that all people belong to the Lord. The "fugitives" the Lord will send as a sign are the Lord's messengers who tells them that all people should see God's glory. The nations named are in southern Spain, Africa, near the Black Sea and Greece, and he says they will come by every means of transport. The final sentence shows how expansive the Lord's vision is in that he will also take priestly leaders from these new people.

Our second reading continues from Hebrews, a heavy theological letter which is difficult to understand. Any parent knows that love and discipline go hand in hand and the author points this out. The use of father-son terminology shows the intimacy of the Lord's relationship with those who believe in him. Since he endured the cross, his followers will also face trials. Today's passage concludes with strong encouragement.

In our gospel, the author proposes a guestion that many of us ponder—who will be saved? Jesus' response about the narrow gate seems restrictive; but read in the fuller context of the gospel it is now about excluding people but about hard work and due diligence—virtues that do not come easy to us. The issue is not the hard work of earning salvation, but the hard work of remaining faithful to the Lord. A sense of urgency permeates this section of the gospel. Will we accept Jesus message sooner rather than later? The acceptance that Jesus desires contrasts with the rejection that he faced, primarily from Jewish leaders. The consequences of that rejection is surprising. He says their place in the kingdom will be taken by people who come from all corners of the earth. These people, many of whom the world considers the least, will be among the first in the kingdom of God. The image of people approaching the table is a parallel to the gathering of nations found in the first reading.

During the month of July, the St. Patrick Food Pantry distributed 19,439 pounds of food to 976 families. This is the largest number of families we have had to date, an increase of close to 200 families which speaks to the growing poverty in Erie. The total cost to the parish for this distribution was \$733.63, all of which was paid through your generosity.

Might I also take a moment to thank you for your generosity in the St. Patrick's Offertory. When I first came here 4 years ago, our weekly offerings were about \$1,600. A few weeks ago we broke all records with a collection of over \$9,000, and we are now averaging between \$6,000 and \$7,000 a week. You make my work much easier, and I hope you know my gratitude.

Northwest Restoration is continuing some exterior work on St. Patrick's Church. As I said earlier, I had not anticipated any of this when we did the restoration. The year before the restoration, we spent over \$140,000 pointing the entire exterior of the building and replacing some roof slates. I think it's simply the nature of an old building. They need constant maintenance and upkeep and we would be foolish to shirk from any of that responsibility. It's an unanticipated expense and not in the budget, but we'll get it paid for. We have completely replaced the roof on the east gable of the church and they are now doing the same with the west gable.

I recently purchased a new green chasuable for St. Patrick's Church to be used for Sunday Masses. The cost is \$250.00. If anyone would like to donate this in memory of someone, please contact me.

Would you consider volunteering to help with the Irish Festival September 13, 14 & 15. The actual festival will run Friday nite and Saturday with Saturday nite again being geared toward young people. Sunday we will host an Irish Breakfast from 8:30 AM until 12:30 PM. Cost is \$9 for adults; \$6 for children under 12 and children under 5 are admitted at no cost. This is our largest fundraising project of the year and the revenue is necessary to help pay for the restoration of the church and support the Food Pantry.. We desperately need volunteers. You can pick the time you can work as well as what it is you might be doing.

From the Pastor's Desk continued......

You may have noticed in a recent bulletin that we listed 19 new families who have joined St. Patrick's Parish in the past month. I'm amazed and thrilled at the number of new parishioners we continue to attract. When I first came here four years ago, we had 201 families. We are now right around 650 families. The diocese tells me that we are the only parish in the entire diocese that is growing at this pace.

We have just completed the financial statements for both St. Hedwig's and St. Patrick's Parishes. Both parishes operated in the black again this year. However, St. Hedwig's operated in the black only because we took some money out of the small amount of savings that the parish has.

Congratulations to Mr. & Mrs. Bob McCarthy who recently celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. They did so with their son Bob who celebrated his 25th anniversary with his wife.

Of the more than 300 not-for-profits who participated in Erie Gives, little St. Patrick's Parish was number 18 in donations. Only 17 large organizations such as the Erie Philharmonic, Erie Day School, Second Harvest Food Bank, Erie Playhouse, Kanzius Cancer Foundation, etc. received more than we did. Parishioners generously donated \$20,273 to the parish. Thank you.

A group of women participated in a seminar on how to live in a loving relationship with your husband. They were asked, "How many of you love your husband?" All the women raised their hands. Then they were asked, "When was the last time you told your husband you loved him?" Some answered today, some said yesterday and some didn't remember. The women were then told to take their phones and send the following text to their husband: "I love you, sweetheart." Then the women were told to exchange phones and read the responding text messages. Here are some of the replies. "What's wrong, are you sick?" "Who the hell is this?" "What now, did you crash the car again?" "I thought we agreed not to drink during the day." "Your mother is coming to stay, isn't she?"
