From the Pastor's Desk.....

Today is the Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time and today all three readings revolve around proper hearing and responding to God's laws and commands. We read first from Deuteronomy where God speaks to the Israelites through Moses in preparation for entering into covenant and giving them the Law. Since the Law—Torah or teaching in Hebrew—comes from God, the people are cautioned not to alter it in any way. As always in the bible, a call to hear divine teaching is accompanied by a summons to act upon what is heard. "Shema" in Hebrew commands the people to "hear" and "obey." The response is not just to the law, but to internalize it so as to foster right relationships with God and the community.

Today we begin hearing from the Letter of James which is really an exhortation for ethical Christian conduct. At the beginning, the author urges anyone who lacks wisdom to ask God for it and it will be freely given. For centuries before the birth of Christ, the Jewish people identified wisdom with divine law (the Torah). For James, the life, death and resurrection of Jesus provides the full interpretation of the law. The letter is very Jewish in its nature. Care for one another calls for self-sacrifice like that of Jesus.

Today we hear of a dispute between Jesus and some Scribes and Pharisees. Scribes were the Scripture scholars of the day and the Pharisee party was particularly concerned to observe all the specific commands of the Torah, which they had determined to number 613. Some of these commands, such as the purity regulations, were not part of the Torah given at Sinai but had developed. Referring his questioners to Isaiah, Jesus attempts to recall the original intent of the Law: right relationships with God, others and material things. Jesus is attempting to get them to understand that God requires an internal assent

to the commands of the Father. Jesus insists that good or evil springs from the heart, and it is the heart that must be attuned to God's Law and its true purpose.

Celebrant of the Masses at St. Patrick's next weekend will be Father Tom Fialkowski, retired pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish. A group of 38 of us are doing a cruise in the Greek Isles and spending some time in Turkey.

This is the time of year when we get a lot of visitors at St. Patrick's and I can't tell you how many of them leave church saying to me, "Father, I've never been in a Catholic church where I felt so welcome. Your people are wonderful." A couple said to me last week, "Someone turned to us at the Sign of Peace and said 'I don't recognize you, are you visiting?' and they welcomed us and said we hope you come back.

Have you considered memorializing deceased members of your family with an ad in our Irish Festival booklet? There are a variety of options open to memorialize a deceased loved one. Forms for the ads are in today's bulletin and can be returned to the parish office.

Thank you for your generous contributions to St. Patrick's Parish in the recent Erie Gives day. We received donations of \$16,500 making St. Patrick's the parish with the highest amount of gifts of any Catholic parish in the county. Thank you for your generosity.

What a great sign of the generosity of this parish that so many of you volunteered to help at the Polish Festival at Holy Trinity. I had no idea so many of you would respond. Thank you for doing that. That's what make St. Patrick's so great.

Our annual Irish Festival is getting closer with each passing week. I hope you'll spread the word

with friends and family and invite them to join in the fun. Remember, even if there is bad weather, everything is under tents and the show will go on. Angie Kontur has done a bang up job as chair this year. Assisting her are Gary and Becky Johnson who will chair next year's festival.

Our children's area did not do well last year, in fact it lost money; and we are eliminating it. In its place, there will be a tent on the lawn between the church and rectory which will have large flat screen TVs to televise the Saturday and Sunday football games.

The festival will also be open for a fixed menu lunch on Friday for employees at Erie Insurance, UPMC Hamot and other downtown businesses.

Also, please return your tickets on the raffle of a trip to Ireland for two. Amazingly last year we had a very low percentage of parishioners who bought tickets on the raffle. I'm hoping this year you will consider reversing that trend and support the raffle. Remember that funds raised in this raffle and the entire festival will be used to pay down the debt on the restoration.



As many of you send your children off to school and to start a new year of education, I think the following letter gives some of the clearest advice I've ever seen on how to raise a child.

World, take my child by the hand—he starts school today! It is all going to be strange and new to him for awhile, and I wish you would sort of treat him gently. You see, up to now, he has been king of the roost. He has been the boss of the back yard. I have always been around to repair his wounds, and I have always been handy to soothe his feelings.

But now things are going to be different. This morning he is going to walk down the front steps, wave his hand, and start on a great adventure that probably will include wars and tragedy and sorrow.

To live in this world will require faith and love and courage. So, world, I wish you would sort of take him by his young hand and teach him the things he will have to know. Teach him—but be gentle if you can.

He will have to learn, I know, that all people are not just, that all men and women are not true. Teach him that for every scoundrel there is a hero; that for every enemy there is a friend. Let him learn early that the bullies are the easiest people to lick.

Teach him the wonder of books., Give him quiet time to ponder the eternal mystery of birds in the sky, bees in the sun, and flowers on a green hill.

Teach him that it is far more honorable to fail than to cheat. Teach him to have faith in his own ideas, even if everyone tells him they are wrong.

Try to give my son the strength not to follow the crowd when everyone else is getting on the bandwagon. Teach him to listen to others, but to filter all he hears on a screen of truth and to take only the good that comes through.

Teach him never to put a price tag on his heart and soul. Teach him to close his ears to the howling of the mob, and to stand and fight if he thinks he is right. Teach him gently, world, but do not coddle him, because only the test of fire makes fine steel.

This is a big order, world, but see what you can do. He is such a wonderful son.


