



Today is the Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time and we hear first from the prophet Jeremiah. Serving Besk to the kingdom of Judah during the reign of Josiah, a reformer king, Jereimiah was called to chastise the people for frequent lapses into idolatry

and faithlessness. For this Jeremiah was attacked, beaten and put into stocks. His life was threatened several times, he was imprisoned and even thrown into a cistern. After the humiliation of being put in stocks, Jeremiah openly laments the consequences of his faithful service to God. But he is so keen on doing God's will that he cannot help but remain a mouthpiece for God. Reluctance and compulsion are at war in Jeremiah, causing great tension. In his youth, he left himself be duped. Now, he rails against a "too strong" God who "triumphed" over him. His efforts have earned him "derision and reproach." As soon as he decides to speak no more, the Word sears his heart and he wearies "holding it in."

The brief passage today from Paul's letter to the Romans delivers a powerful message. Make your whole life a worthy sacrifice. We no longer offer in sacrifice the bodies of dead animals; instead, we offer our living selves that are "holy and acceptable." That offering becomes our "spiritual worship." Christians must remember that we are in but not of the world. Paul reminds us not to conform ourselves to the age in which we live, but to "be transformed."

Like the "word" that burns in Jeremiah, Jesus' mission burns within him. To deny it is to deny his very self. He understands the price of fidelity to the divine will. Because the world is dark and sinful, it will come against the light and innocence of Christ. He knows he must prepare himself for what lies ahead. But Peter doesn't understand this. His divinely granted recognition of Jesus as the Messiah is not matched by intuition regarding the fate that awaits Jesus. So Peter plays Satan and wins Jesus' sharp rebuke for becoming an obstacle to his resolve. Peter is deeply offended. When he proclaimed Jesus as Messiah, he likely pictured the traditional hero riding into battle, not trudging to his death under the weight of the cross. He wants to erase such images from Jesus' mind and his own. Jesus does not need Peter to dilute his resolve and slaps him with a

stinging reprimand. But immediately the criticism turns into a teaching moment as he observes that human and divine thought are world's apart. And finally. Jesus enunciates the demanding nature of discipleship. His standards are uncompromising. Anything but total surrender to God's kingdom is futile wheel-spinning. Lose your life, if you would find it, he says; deny yourselves, to avoid destroying yourselves.

Next Sunday we will host our annual Mission Appeal and the homilies will be given by Sisters of St. Benedict.

During the month of July, the St. Patrick Food Pantry distributed 20,472 pounds of food to 918 families. The cost to the parish was \$3,200.16, all of which has been covered by your generous donations to the Food Pantry. God does not forget those who take care of the less fortunate.

People have asked me where the clients come from at the Food Pantry. They must live in a designated area which has been determined by the First Harvest Food Bank and be of limited income. There are several volunteers each week who verify that clients meet these criteria. As you can imagine, there are always people trying to beat the system, but they don't get past some of our volunteers!!! People who have been verified are also checked at regular intervals to make sure they still qualify.

The new Gannon Rec Center was dedicated this past Friday morning, and what a great addition to our neighborhood. The \$17 million project is state of the art and first class. You need not be a Gannon student or alumni to use the Rec. Center. If

interested, just contact the Rec Center for details and pricing.

People sometimes complain about all of the nonprofits we have in downtown Erie, ie., Gannon, Hamot, etc. But we also have to ask the question, "What would downtown Erie be without them?" Along with Erie Insurance, these nonprofits are the anchors that hold the downtown area together. Look at some of the other areas of downtown and then look at what Gannon, Hamot and others have done to stabilize the area.

Congratulations to St. Patrick parishioners Don and Janie Pastore who just recently celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary.

The Irish Festival is fast approaching and the volunteers have been incredibly busy getting ready. I think we are pretty well prepared. There is a genuine sense of excitement about moving the festival back to the church grounds, but we know there will be some mishaps as we do this for the first time, so I ask everyone—both volunteers and people attending—to be patient. We'll work out all of the kinks and by next year it will be as smooth as can be.

Our maintenance staff has been painting the eves and second and third floor windows in the rectory for the past several months. None of us realized until they got up there in a highlift, just how much copper there is up on the building. It's so high with three stories that no one has been up there to do any painting or repair work for years, but we hope to finish it this summer. We are also going to replace most of the shrubbery in the front of the rectory.
