



From the Pastor's

Today is the 22nd Sunday in ordinary time and our first reading comes to us from the Book of Sirach. Ben Sira, its Besk a author, lived during the late third and early second centuries BC, probably in Jerusalem. He wrote the book to instruct people in the advantages of

the Jewish over the Greek way of life. Today's passage is about humility. The greater one's station in life, the more one needs humility. For some reason, verse 19 is not included today and it is one of the most important about humility as it says it is to the humble, rather than the proud, that God grants understanding. When we act humbly, we bring glory to God. The final sentence tells us that wise people appreciate proverbs and are always alert for wisdom. He concludes by noting that water puts out fire, and that we can prevent the damage done by our sins by giving alms.

Our second reading continues from Hebrews and presents us with two assemblies. The first is the gathering of the Israelites at Mount Sinai for the sealing of the covenant and the giving of the Law. The second stanza paints the picture of Jesus' followers gathering in the heavenly Jerusalem to receive the new covenant sealed in his blood.

By noting that Jesus is dining at the home of one of the leading Pharisees on a Sabbath, the opening sentence of today's gospel reminds us of the continuing controversy between Jesus and the Pharisees, a controversy which began at the end of Luke 13. Jesus notes the guests taking places of honor, and, as a good teacher, he does not let a teachable moment pass. He tells a parable about humility which links the gospel to the first reading today. This parable, unique to Luke, involves not only how we act as guests at others' banquets, but whom we invite when we host a gathering. Jesus' way of thinking is different from the prevailing Greek and Roman attitudes of the day that we invite our family and friends because they will invite us back. He encourages that we invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, the outcasts. These are the people whom Jesus invites to the heavenly banquet and the ones we should invite to the Eucharistic banquet now.

Tomorrow, September 2, is Labor Day and the parish office will be closed.

It is only two weeks until our Irish Festival. Have you purchased raffle tickets on an all expense week in Ireland for two? The grand prize includes air fare out of either Buffalo or Cleveland, a rental car and 6 nites in Irish B & B's. Anyone who has stayed in an Irish B & B knows that you will experience the ultimate in Irish hospitality.

We're also still in need of volunteers to help with the festival. This is our largest fundraising event of the year and the revenue from it will be used to pay off our debt on the restoration of the church and to support our food pantry. I hope you'll support us in the project.

Sunday morning from 8:30 until 12:30 we will be serving a full Irish Breakfast. Cost is \$9 for adults, \$6 for children under 12 and children under 5 admitted free. In addition to the Irish breakfast, Bloody Mary's, Mimosa, etc. will be available. A local farmer will also be present with some sheep to show us how the sheep are sheared to make wool. A sheep would ultimately die if it were not sheared and so the process is a necessity and in parts of Ireland is still done by handas we will have the opportunity to see. The menu includes Corned Beef Hash, Irish bacon, scrambled eggs, Irish muffins, bangers, fried tomatoes, mushrooms, seasoned white beans, oatmeal and coffee, tea or milk. Quite a meal for less than \$10!! Calamari's is catering the breakfast as well as all of the food for the festival .

I'm grateful to St. Patrick parishioner Pat Doyle for orchestrating the installation of a camera in St. Patrick's Church which will now make the online homilies both audio and video. This camera was donated by Mr. & Mrs. Bill Bloomstine, Atty. & Mrs. Jay Habas, Mr. & Mrs. Robert Schenker, Mr. & Mrs. Craig McCune. Marilyn McClelland and Mr. & Ms. James Herdzik.

On Thursday at 2 PM, St. Patrick's Church will host an interfaith Memorial Service for the War Dead of Erie County. Bishop Persico, Bishop Sean Rowe of the Episcopal Diocese, the heads of the Lutheran, Baptist, Methodist, Church of Christ, Presbyterian and Temple Anshe Hesed will all participate. Mark Alloway has assembled a rather large choir accompanied by timpani, pipe organ, trumpet and bugle. The ceremony should be very nice and is open to the public. There will

be a strong patriotic theme to the event. The ROTC Honor Guard of Academy High School will lead the procession. Music will include "America," "The Navy Hymn," and "The Battle Hymn of the Republic." Following the ceremony, people are invited to go to Dobbins Landing where a statue will be dedicated. Then, at 5 PM, the tall ships will come through the channel into the bay. The weekend will continue with a grand finale and huge fireworks display on Sunday evening. How great to support this event by attending the Memorial Service for those who gave their lives that you and I might enjoy the freedoms we have.
