From the Pastor's Desk.....

Today is the Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time and we read from Numbers. The fourth book of the Pentateuch. Numbers is a loose collection of accounts related to the Hebrew's wilderness journey toward the Promised Land. It includes several census lists, a "numbering" of the people that gives the book its name, several trials including lack of water and food and clashes with various peoples the Hebrews met on their way into Canaan. Immediately before today's reading, Moses has grown exasperated with the people: tiring of manna they complain about the lack of meat. Moses in turn laments to God pleading that he cannot carry the burden of the entire people himself. After promising an abundance of meat, God instructs Moses to gather seventy elders around him. When he has done so, the Lord comes down to share his presence with the elders. When two of those who had been called are tardy but also receive the divine spirit, Joshua objects. Moses cautions his young aide to make no attempt to restrict God's spirit.

Today's reading from James shifts from instructions on how to live a righteous life to warnings for those who ignore such teachings. Today he warns those who accumulate great wealth, stressing that the world is transitory. Furthermore, those who have cheated others to gain their wealth will find God on the side of the poor.

Mark structures the middle section of his gospel to stress both Jesus's identity as Messiah who must suffer and die and his disciples failure to grasp this reality. Peter's confession of faith in Jesus as Messiah—and his refusal to connect that identity with Jesus's impending passion marks the beginning of this three-part section. In each part, Jesus announces his coming passion and death, then the disciples show their refusal to believe this and finally concludes with Jesus

giving them more instruction. Today we hear Jesus cautioning John not to try to limit God's power just as we heard Moses cautioning Joshua in our first reading. Then Mark includes a number of sayings. There was an early written collection of Jesus's sayings called "Quelle" which Mark had access to and he is most likely copying from that.

Of all the good things that have happened at St. Patrick's, something happened recently that touches my heart more than anything. Thanks to the initiative and leadership of St. Patrick parishioner and Eucharistic Minister Katie Froehlich, St. Patrick's Parish now has a Young Adults' Group. Katie recently moved back to Erie from Chicago where she was very active in a parish with a Young Adults' Group. She asked me if she could try to form one here. I was thrilled with her request and encouraged her but said to myself, "I don't think there are enough young adults here to form a group." I'm never been happier to be proven wrong. A group has now formed of about 20 people, the group is primarily social in nature, they are going to meet for a monthly happy hour at one of the local pubs, play some sports together, share some trips to nearby areas, etc. They are all young adult Catholics who belong here and want to get together with other young adults who share their faith. I never would have thought we would have a group like this here, and I hope you share my joy at their formation.

We have been repaying the diocese the advance they gave us for the restoration at the rate of \$10,000 plus interest each month. For the past several months, I have been able to pay them \$20,000 plus interest each month. We have reduced that debt from \$720,000 to \$260,000. Thank you for your generous support of this.

Likewise, with pledges of \$95,000 in this year's Catholic Services Appeal, we already have payments of \$75,000.

From the Pastor's Desk continued......

Our Irish Festival is in two weeks and everything appears to be in place thanks to Angie Kontur's leadership and the time and effort of so many who are chairing various committees. I hope that you will purchase tickets on the raffle of a trip to Ireland and return those to the rectory, and I hope that you'll be able to stop at the festival and join in the fun. This year we are not having a brunch on Sunday, but will have the festival itself.

The weekend football games will all be televised in a special tent with beer and food available to any who want to watch the games.

The sidewalk replacement should be completed by now. I still have one section left to do next year. Once we finish with the sidewalks, I'm happy to tell you that both of our buildings and grounds are in excellent condition. Last year we focused on the rectory and repointed the entire exterior, reset all of the windows, etc. On the inside, we have installed central air conditioning, a complete new electrical system, etc. Now it just becomes a matter of keeping up with the maintenance so that we don't fall behind again. Would you believe that the morning after I wrote this, I came down and went into my office to discover that the ceiling is falling down!!! Every time I think we've won the battle, something else comes up. Again, we have to remember that these are 100 year old buildings and these things are to be excepted.

We've also restored the front entrance way. The storm door was rusting and paint was peeling on the trim, and that has now been replaced. We're hoping before winter to paint the exterior of the Food Pantry. The interior was redone recently and is in great shape.

"Sometimes after playing golf, I reflect on all the beer I drink. I feel ashamed. Then I look into the glass and I think about the workers in the brewery and all of their hopes and dreams. If I didn't drink beer, they might be out of work and their dreams would be shattered. I think, 'It is better to drink this beer and let their dreams come true than be selfish and worry about my liver.'"
