



Today is the 27th Sunday in Ordinary time and we hear from Genesis which sets the stage for the Gospel. Our second reading from Hebrews emphasizes Christ as both human and divine. The gospel is Jesus talking about marriage as well as divorce, but his talking about divorce must be understood in the context of its day when a man could "divorce" or throw a woman out for no reason at all. This is clearly what Jesus is railing against in this case.

Cardinal Carlo Martini was archbishop of Milan, Italy for 20 years and one of the most respected Scripture scholars in the church. A few weeks prior to his recent death, he gave an interview on the church, and let me share some of it with you. "How do you see the situation of the Church?" "The church is tired, in prosperous Europe and America. Our culture is out of date; our churches are big, our religious houses are empty and the bureaucratic apparatus is growing, and our rites and our vestments are pompous. Do such things really express what we are today?.....Prosperity weighs us down. We find ourselves like the rich young man who went away sad when Jesus called him to become his disciple. I know that it's not easy to leave everything behind. At least we could seek people who are free and closer to their neighbors. Where among us are heroes to inspire us? We must never limit them by institutional bonds"....."Who can help the Church today?" Fr. Karl Rahner liked to use the image of embers hidden under ashes. I see in the Church today so many ashes above the embers that I'm often assailed by a sense of powerlessness. How can the embers be freed from the ashes in order to rekindle the flame of love? First of all, we have to look for those embers. Where are the individuals full of generosity, like the Good Samaritan? Who have faith like the Roman centurion? Who are as enthusiastic as John the Baptist? Who dare new things, as Paul did? I advise the pope and the bishops to look for twelve people outside the lines for administrative posts-people who are close to the poorest and who are surrounded by young people and are trying out new things. We need that comparison with people who are burning so that the spirit can spread everywhere.

"What means do you advise against the Church's weariness?" "I have three. The first is conversion: the Church has to recognize its own errors and has to travel a radical journey of change, beginning with the pope and bishops. The scandals of pedophilia are driving us to undertake a journey of conversion. Questions about sexuality and all the themes involving the body are an example of this. They are important for everyone, at times they're also too important. In this area, is Church still a point of reference or only a caricature in the media?

The second is the Word of God. Vatican II restored the Bible to Catholics. Only someone who receives this Word in his heart can be among those who will help the renewal of the Church and will know how to respond to personal questions wisely. The Word of God is simple and seeks as its companion a heart that is listening. Never the clergy or the Church law can substitute for a person's inwardness. All the external rules, the laws, the dogmas were given to us in order to clarify the inner voice and to discern the spirits.

For whom are the sacraments? They are the third means of healing. The sacraments are not a disciplinary instrument, but a help for people at moments on their journey and when life makes them weak. Are we bringing the sacraments to those who need a new strength.

The Church is two hundred years behind. Why is it not being stirred? Are we afraid? Afraid, instead of courageous? Faith is the Church's foundation—faith, confidence, courage. I'm old and ill and depend on the help of others. The good people around me enable me to experience love. This love is stronger than the feeling of discouragement that I sometimes feel in looking at the Church in Europe. Only love conquers weariness. God is love."

Very interesting comments from one of the most illustrious churchmen of our day.

Bishop Lawrence Persico will be joining us for the 175th Anniversary Banquet on Oct. 20th. It should be a fun evening for all and a chance to meet the new bishop. If you have not yet made your reservation, please do so as soon as possible. I'm grateful to Erin Doolin Fessler for putting together a brief video of parish anecdotes which will be shown that evening. Jeff Rouse, who restored our Stations of the Cross, will speak briefly on the stations. He has also volunteered to come up and clean them after the restoration is done.

From the Pastor's Desk continued......

Today's bulletin contains the financial statements for both St. Patrick's and St. Hedwig's parishes. As you can readily see, we are doing extremely well at St. Patrick's. We undertook a great deal of capital repairs this past year with a complete new electrical system for the church, the work on the exterior of the building and the new airconditioning. The 2012/2013 statement will not look as good because we will show some debt from the church restoration, but we can absorb that easily. St. Hedwig's expenses fluctuate because of extraordinary repairs that the buildings require. We should be pretty current with those now.

The artists from Conrad Schmitt are working on the ceiling and we can look up through the scaffolding and see some of the gold gilding which they are doing. It's exciting.

Just an update on our capital campaign. We had a goal of \$1 million and to date have pledges of \$1,070,000 and payments of \$405,307. Thank you for your continued generosity.

The new lighting for the interior of the church has arrived and Church Electric will shortly start installing it. One of the things I learned when we went to the Conrad Schmitt Studio in Milwaukee is that lighting is as important as painting.

After explaining the commandment to honor your father and mother, a Sunday school teacher asked her class if there was a commandment that teaches us how to treat our brothers and sisters. One boy, the oldest in his family, immediately answered, "You shalt not kill."




Sunday Breakfast at St. James
