

Today is the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time and we hear first from the Book of Wisdom. We are reminded that Pest even the smallness of the universe compared to God's expansive powers does not prevent God from loving all

things. Since we love within the limits of our humanity, it is difficult for us to imagine this. In our attempts at love, sin still creeps in and often makes human love conditional, rather than unconditional. The message of Wisdom is clear: God's love, exemplified by his constant mercy. will never cease. God hates nothing he has created. Everything that is belongs to him. I'm always baffled by how some strongly religious people can say that God, for example, hates gay people. God created them and he loves them as equally as he loves the next person he created.

For the next three Sundays, our second reading will come from Paul's second letter to the Thessalonians. In this letter, he is writing them to avoid false teachings regarding the parousia, or the second coming of Christ and to endure patiently until the Lord arrives. Paul is asking them not to panic because of a rumor, etc. predicting that the day of the Lord is imminent. "Remain calm," is his message. The early church had an enormous struggle with this issue as they initially felt the second coming of Jesus would occur almost immediately. When it didn't, they began to lose faith.

The opening paragraph of today's gospel sets the scene for this well-known gospel passage. Zacchaeus, who name means "clean," was not highly regarded because he was a tax collector who was very wealthy. The story will not disparage him for his wealth, but rather will show how followers of Jesus can correctly manage money and possessions by sharing them with the poor. Zacchaeus' joy as he receives Jesus into his home is countered by the grumbling of the crowd because Jesus is eating at the home of someone they consider a sinner. Whether Zaccheaus thought himself a sinner or not is immaterial. What is important is that he decides to give half of his possessions to the poor and return fourfold anything he has extorted. His words express a commitment to a new life, a life changed because he has found Jesus. Because he is a descendent of Abraham, Zaccheaus is a sign that salvation will come through Israel.

Celebrant of the Saturday evening 5 PM Mass at St. Patrick's next weekend will be Father Dennis Martin, chaplain at St. Vincent Health Center. Celebrant of the Sunday morning 8 & 10:30 Masses at St. Patrick's and the 9 AM Mass at St. Hedwig's will be Monsignor Richard Sullivan, the retired pastor of St. Andrew's Parish. I'm going out to Palm Springs, CA for a week to visit with old friends, but I promise to come back!!

In last week's bulletin, I noted that November is traditionally the month when we pray for the dead and I listed some of the old customs and superstitions that surrounded death. Let me share with you today how our Jewish brothers and sisters deal with death.

Belief about the afterlife among the Jews varies if the person is Orthodox, Reform or Conservative. At the time of death, a person's eyes are closed, and the body is covered and laid on the floor. Candles are then lit and the body is never left alone. Eating and drinking around the body are not permitted. In Jewish law, being around a dead body causes uncleanliness so often the washing of the body and preparation for burial will be carried out by a special group of volunteers who consider the deed a holy act. Jews may not be cremated or embalmed. In Israel a coffin is rarely used but elsewhere a coffin is almost always used. The body is wrapped in a white shroud. Burial takes place as soon as possible following death. A family member will throw a handful of earth in the casket with the body to put the body in close contact with the earth. Jewish law also says that each grave must have a tombstone to remember the deceased. A candle is lit after returning from the cemetery to mark seven days of mourning, called Shivah.

When Sister Marie Therese died recently at our own Carmelite Monastery, she was not embalmed, was dressed in her Carmelite habit and laid on a raised table just inside the grill which separates the chapel where the nuns pray from the public chapel. She was facing the grill, had no shoes on her feet and rose petals were scattered on her body and around it. At the time of burial, she was covered with a shroud and lowered into the grave. No coffin is used and usually the other nuns in the monastery would have dug the grave, lowered her in and then shoveled the

dirt back in. Because there are only two nuns left at Carmel and they are both in their 90s, others did the grave work.

Several parishioners have asked me where they can get the homilies that Pope Francis gives each day at his Mass. Google "Whispers in the Loggia," and then scroll down on the right hand side when it comes up and you'll find a box with a variety of news items in it. Pope Francis' homily is always in there. They are relatively brief, very easy to understand and powerful. In addition, a young man in the parish who works in this field is designing a blog page for me so that I can put some of Pope Francis's homilies, etc. on there for you to read. I can also post other Catholic happenings so that we're all better informed of some real renewal that is going on in the church today.

I have just made the move from St. Hedwig's to St. Patrick's third floor. Once I get everything squared away, we'll have an open house after weekend Masses if any of you want to see it. It has turned out very nice, and I'm thrilled.

In the process of putting in an apartment, we ran into electrical problems; in fact we discovered that there have been sparks in some of the boxes in the attic. When we re-wired the church as part of the restoration, Tom Church told me that this house has to be re-wired, and so we decided to go ahead and completely re-wire the rectory. You have no idea how nice it is not to have fuses blowing all of the time when we run our computers and other office equipment. Because the parish has grown so much, the office staff has also grown and we're constantly having to reset fuses. I do not think anything has been done electrically in the house in probably over 50 years.

Paddy was driving down the street in a sweat because he had an important meeting and couldn't find a parking place. Looking up to heaven, he said, "Lord, take pity on me. If you find me a parking place, I will go to Mass every Sunday for the rest of my life and give up me Irish whiskey!" Miraculously, a parking place appeared. Paddy looked up again and said, "Never Mind, I found one!"
