






Today is the last Sunday of the church year and it is always celebrated as the Feast of Christ the King. We read first from Second Samuel with a gathering of the Israelites at Hebron to recall that the Lord appointed David as their king. For some rea-

son the church doesn't include the full reading where we hear the Lord promise to raise up an heir to David when he rests with his ancestors. In that section the prophet Nathan says that the Lord will be like a father to this heir and he will be like a son to him. Christians see Jesus as the fulfillment of this messianic prophecy.

Our second reading is the *Christ Hymn*, perhaps the best known passage in Colossians. This same reading was proclaimed on the fifteenth Sunday of the year. This ancient liturgical hymn has two sections. The first describes Christ's role in creation. He is the firstborn of creation on the basis of his Resurrection from the dead. Everything in heaven and on earth was created in him. The second part of the hymn details Christ's redemptive role. Phrases from the first part are repeated in order to emphasize Christ's relationship to the created world. There is also a statement of Christ's relationship to the Church which, for the first time in the New Testament, identifies him as the head of the church

"The people stood by and watched." This Lucan observation occurs in the first half of verse 35 but it is omitted today. Its importance lies in the fact that it contrasts the people's reaction to that of the rulers, soldiers, etc. who mock Jesus. The people have yet to voice a judgment about Jesus' identity while the negative statements of those who jeer at Jesus all contain a Christological confession. Jesus is the "Christ of God, "the King of the Jews." Yet it is one of the criminals, the one referred to as the "good thief," who offers the gospel's final confession when he calls Jesus by name. The scene with the good thief is unique to Luke and consistent with his emphasis on Jesus as the forgiving Savior who reaches out to embrace sinners. Our gospel passage closes with Jesus responding to the good thief and telling him that "today" he is in paradise. For Luke, paradise is neither a reality apart from Jesus nor completely something that occurs in the future. In Paradise we will live forever with Jesus; our paradise begins today.

Next Sunday is the first Sunday of Advent, the beginning of our new church year. As we begin Advent, we will meet John the Baptist whose parents were Elizabeth (cousin to Mary) and Zechariah, who was one of about 18,000 Jewish priests in Palestine at the time of Jesus. They were divided into 24 groups of 750 each. Twice a year, each group came to the temple in Jerusalem to serve for a week. Their roles were chosen by lot. Each morning, four lots were cast to decide who would carry out the four tasks at the altar. In the afternoon, a fifth lot was cast to determine who would enter the Holy Place to offer evening incense. This privilege usually came only once in a lifetime. This was how Zechariah was chosen and it was at this moment that the angel appeared to him to announce the birth of John.

The name "Elizabeth" was not a common name in Jewish culture. The only person known by that name was the wife of Aaron. The Hebrew word "EI" means "God;" the name Elizabeth means "God is the fullness." As a descendent of Aaron, Elizabeth was of the priestly class. This means that any of her sons would be eligible to serve as a priest in the temple.

It is only Luke who tells us about Elizabeth and Zechariah. The other three gospels do not mention them. Most scholars feel Luke either knew Mary or knew someone who had known her because it is only from Luke that we get all of these stories about Mary and her family.

Bishop Persico has written pastors asking if we have a facility we can open to help people, and we do not, but here is an excellent opportunity to serve the most vulnerable of God's people.
