



Today is the 3rd Sunday of Advent and we hear our first reading from the prophet Zephaniah. He speaks to his people around 630 BC. When David was king, Israel consisted of 12 tribes, but the nation split in 922

BC. The northern kingdom, called Israel, consisted of ten tribes, and was defeated by the Assyrians in 721 BC. The southern nation, Judah, courted the Assyrians, but then came the prophets Josiah and Zephaniah who call the people back to fidelity to their God. And today's reading is in that context. He is telling them that once they reform and live in fidelity to God, they will no longer have any reason to fear their enemies.

In our second reading, Paul, like Zephaniah, is telling the people to rejoice, knowing that God is with them. For Paul, rejoicing in God always means not just during good times, but also during bad times. He reminds the people not just to pray to God by asking for things, but also to pray in thanksgiving for all they have been given. You will notice that our readings are more and more filled with joy and hope as we get closer to Christmas.

In our gospel, we hear again from John the Baptist who last week proclaimed a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People are listening and the first crowd to ask what they are to do are his own followers to whom he says they should share their food and clothing. Next are the tax collectors and soldiers who were hated by the people, and John tells them not to collect anything more than what is due. John makes such an impression that many who hear him think he is the Messiah, and John does everything to discourage those ideas. When John speaks of the coming of Christ he speaks of one who will judge everyone, but when Christ actually comes in Luke's gospel, he comes much more to heal, to forgive, to invite people into the kingdom.

Our Christmas schedule is a 4:30 PM Vigil Mass at St. Hedwig's on Christmas Eve and at St. Patrick's a 5 PM and a 9 PM Mass. On Christmas day, there is a 9 AM Mass at St. Hedwig's and a 10:30 PM Mass at St. Patrick's. Please be forewarned that the 5 PM Christmas Eve Mass at St. Patrick's is literally overflowing to the rafters and if you want a seat, it will be necessary for you to get there early. The 9 PM Mass is much more subdued.

There will be two reserved pews at the 5 PM Mass for the 2 families who won them in the raffle at our Irish Festival. I'll do anything to raise money for the church!!!

We will be able to return to St. Patrick's Church next weekend. The sound system we have been using at Cauley is the church sound system and that has to be taken apart and reinstalled in church. Doing this during the week is better than trying to do it on Christmas Eve.

Depending on our schedule we may continue having Mass in the rectory weekday chapel until we can get the carpet cleaned in the church's weekday chapel and everything put back together again.

I'm feeling like a little kid at Christmas with the excitement I'm experiencing anticipating your seeing the church for the first time. I think you're going to be enormously pleased. It is much more than I would have expected, and I'm certainly thrilled with it. I think of what those poor penniless Irish immigrants must have thought when they first saw this magnificent church, and now we get to see it restored to all of its glory.

All of our bills have now been paid for the Irish Festival and I'm thrilled to tell you that the parish netted \$63,000 this year!! That is up from \$36,000 the previous year. I'm grateful to Cal Pifer for his leadership as well as all of the people who volunteered. We are very fortunate that we have so many young people in the parish who are willing to help with the festival. As I mentioned to you, we're going to incur a debt with the restoration largely because we had to do so much work on the exterior and the roof. I estimate our debt will be somewhere between \$200,000 and \$250,000, but we can use the festival proceeds each year to pay that down and have it paid for in less than five years.

For New Year's, there will be a 5:30 PM Vigil Mass at St. Hedwig's and a 9 AM Mass at St. Patrick's on New Year's Day. There will not be a 12:05 PM Mass on New Year's.

Please keep your pledge payments coming as I have to make a monthly \$10,000 payment to the diocese for the first year while the drive goes on and then we'll pay \$50,000 a year plus the interest.

From the Pastor's Desk continued......

Jeff Rouse, the artist who restored the Stations of the Cross and who spoke at our 175th dinner, is here this weekend and trained a small crew of parishioners to clean the Stations. The first thing he did was comment on what a difference with the new lighting. Not only do the Stations pop out at you, but you can very clearly see the canvas painting on the back wall where it was very difficult to see in the past.

Our new lighting panel in the sacristy has several pre-set buttons whereby, for example, we can light just the Stations of the Cross or we can hit one button and light the entire church at once. We will have a setting for the way we dim the lights at Christmas while we sing Silent Night, etc.

Kudos to St. Patrick parishioners Bill & Patty Gloeckler who chaired the very successful recent Barber Center Christmas Ball. Last year's was chaired by Tim & Claire Wachter whose parents, Dick & Mary Beth Wachter, are St. Patrick parishioners. Anything any of us can do to support the incredible good work of the Barber Center is well worth our efforts. This organization provides hope and new life for more people than we will ever know.

There is a new book which features St. Patrick's Church rather prominently: *The Work of William Ginther, Ecclesiastical Architect* by Anthony Valleriano. Ginther designed St. Patrick's Church. The book is available through Amazon.
